Explanation: This supplemental allocation appropriates an additional \$575.00 to the 2022 Emergency Management Performance Grant. The grant amount included in the FY2023 Adopted Budget was \$85,000. The EMPG program provides resources to local government emergency management agencies, an all-hazards approach to emergency response, including the development of a comprehensive program of planning, training, and exercises, as well as staffing/EOC upgrades. This grant program requires a 100% local match which is obtained through the Office of Emergency Management personnel salary.

Issuance of General Obligation Bonds and Bond Anticipation Notes - For the purpose of authorizing and empowering the City of Annapolis (the "City") to issue and sell, upon its full faith and credit, (i) one or more series of its general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$26,000,000 (the "Bonds"), pursuant to Sections 19-301 through 19-309, inclusive, of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, and Article VII, Section 11 of the Charter of the City of Annapolis, as amended (the "Charter") and (ii) one or more series of its general obligation bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds in the maximum aggregate principal amount equal to the maximum aggregate principal amount of the Bonds (the "Notes"), pursuant to Sections 19-211 through 19-221, inclusive, of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, and the Charter; providing that the Bonds and Notes shall be issued and sold to finance and refinance certain public purposes of the City as provided in this Ordinance; prescribing the form and tenor of the Bonds and Notes; providing for the method of sale of the Bonds and Notes and other matters relating to the issuance and sale thereof; providing for the disbursement of the proceeds of the Bonds and Notes; covenanting to levy and collect all taxes necessary to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds and Notes; and generally providing for and determining various matters relating to the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds and Notes.
