

## REVISED FISCAL IMPACT NOTE

Title: City Co-Sponsored Benefit Concert Special Event - Annapolis Rising Festival

Date: August 31, 2018

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

This resolution proposes to waive the special event fees associated with the Annapolis Rising Concert held for the benefit of the families of the Capital Gazette shooting and the first responders.

When this resolution was introduced on first reader, the fiscal note provided estimated the fees would be \$32,060. The actual fees of \$33,972 are as follows:

The total fees were \$1,912 more than estimated. Police Department overtime and reimbursement for DGS officers was \$1,041 more than estimated; Fire department overtime was \$166 more than estimated; Transportation costs were \$60 more than estimated; and Department of Public Works costs were \$645 more than estimated.
