F. If the Commission determines as a result of a public hearing that the owner's property meets the definition demolition by neglect, the Commission shall pass an order of abatement. The Commission's order shall set forth findings of fact which support the determination, the terms for abatement, and a deadline to complete the abatement. The Director of Planning and Zoning, in consultation with the Chief of Historic Preservation,

shall thereafter enforce the Commission's order in accordance with his/her powers as authorized by this Zoning Code.
