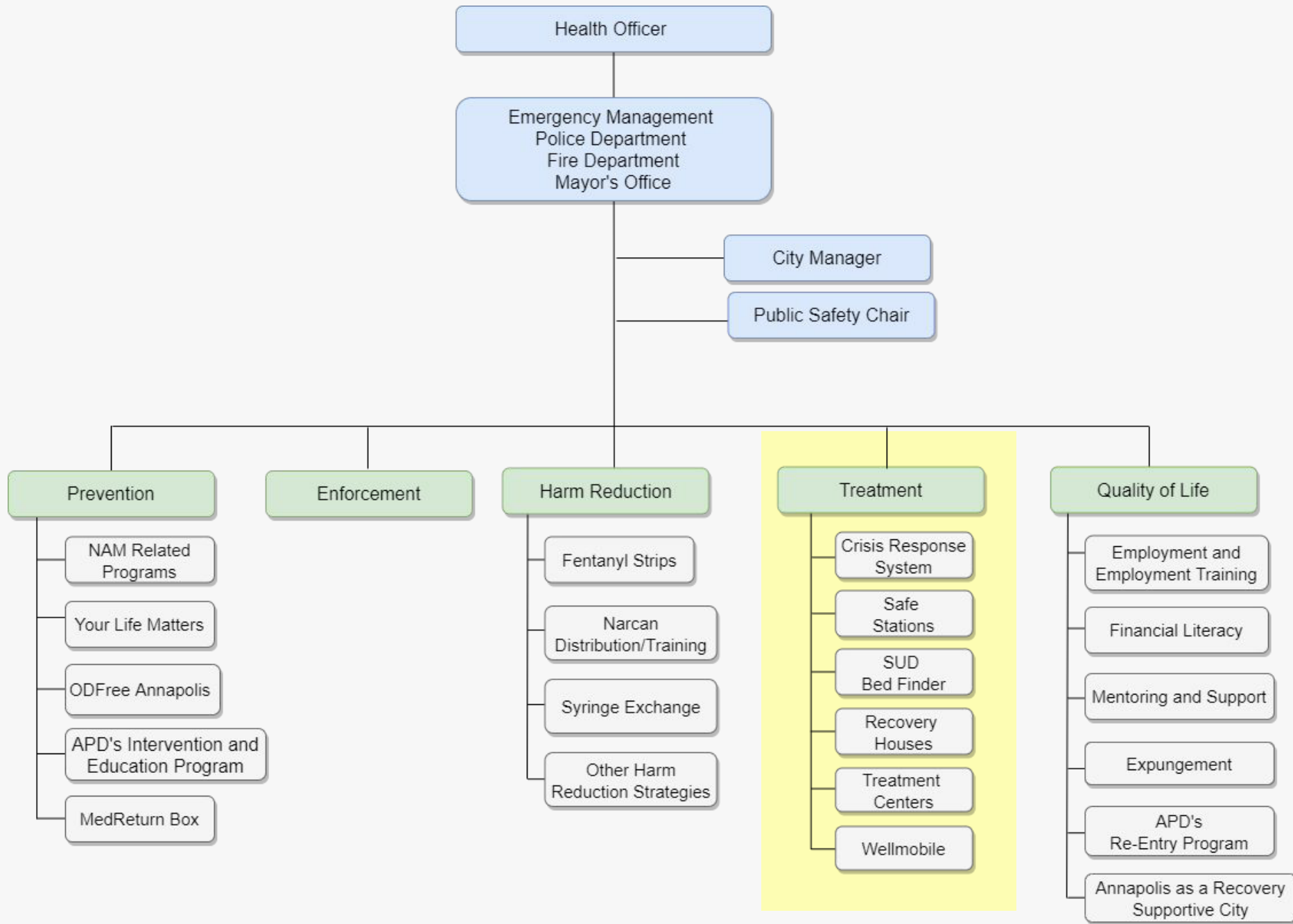


AA Power is a behavioral health program within the Anne Arundel County Department of Health.

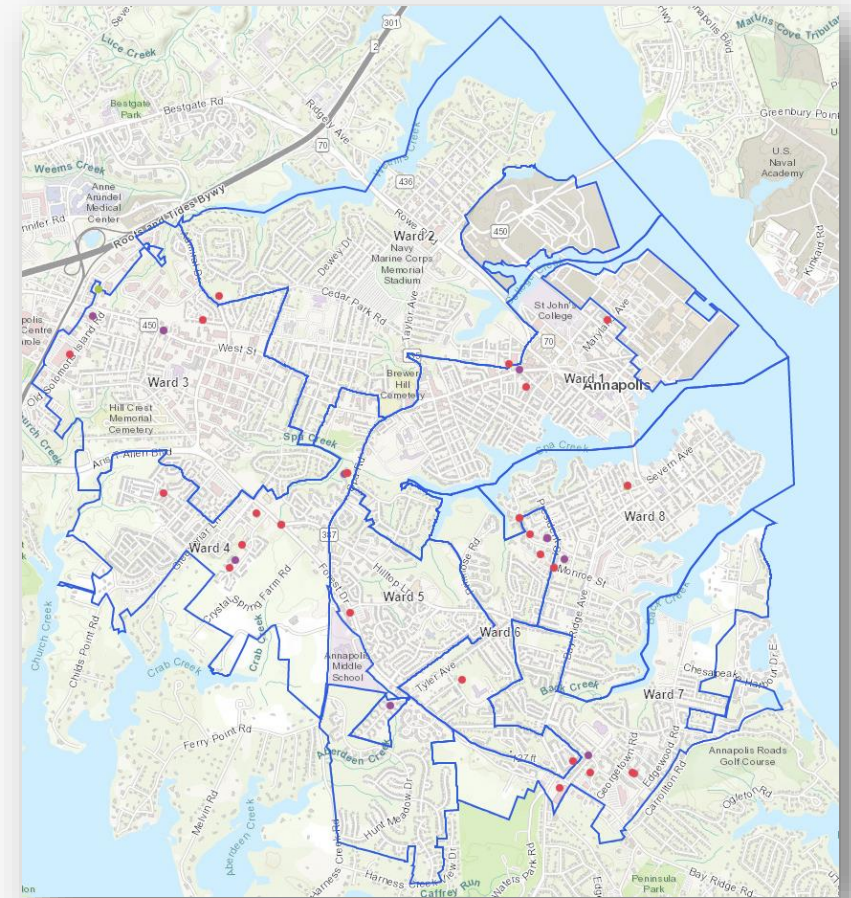

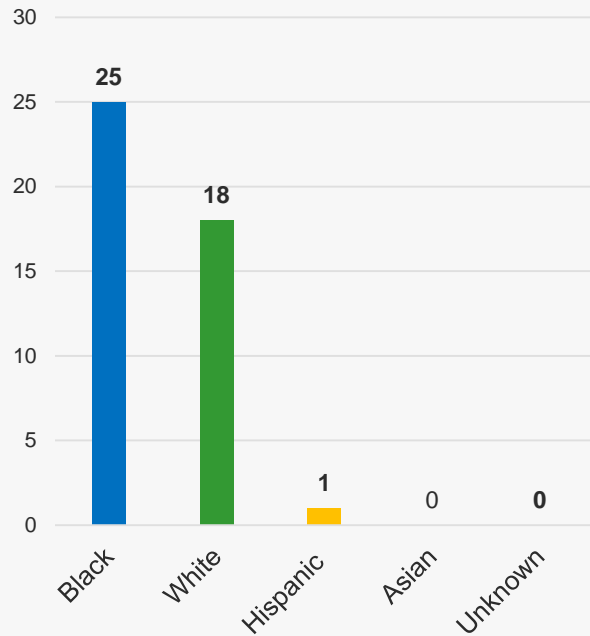

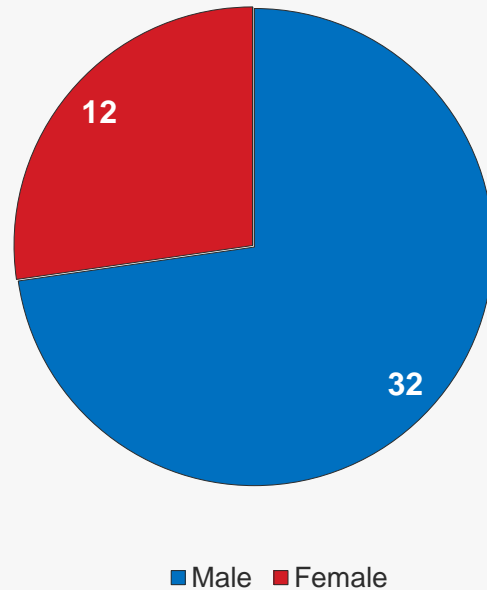

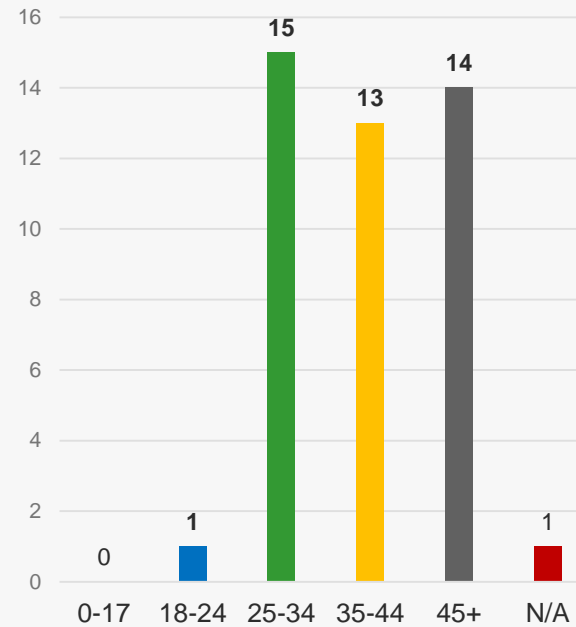

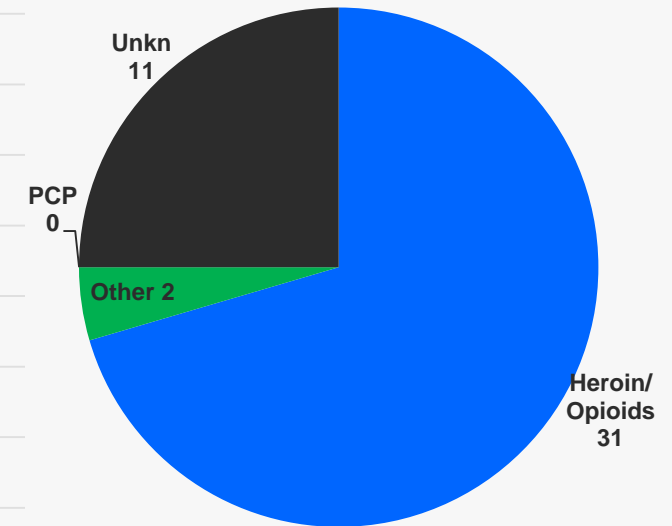
