Landlord-Tenant Relations – Relocation Expenses

DATE: June 20, 2023

POSITION: Oppose

The Maryland Judiciary opposes Ordinance O-21-23. This ordinance provides that a landlord shall pay relocation expenses to a tenant(s) who is permanently or temporarily displaced by city condemnation in the City of Annapolis.

The District Court of Maryland is a statewide court system designed to provide the uniform application of law to all who come before it. This bill would cause the landlord tenant law to apply differently in one jurisdiction and infringe on the current uniform rent escrow code resulting in an inequitable application of the law across the state and even more specifically in Anne Arundel County. There should be statewide consistency and equity in how landlord/tenant cases are processed across Maryland. In addition, the time frames outlined in the bill are not realistic.
