25 **FOR** the purpose of approving an Emergency Meeting Memorandum of Understanding  
26 between the City of Annapolis and Anne Arundel County Public Schools for use of  
27 certain County property in the event of an emergency.

29 **WHEREAS,** AACPS owns and operates the Administration Building and surrounding parking  
30 lot at 2644 Riva Road in Anne Arundel County (“Administration Building”); and

32 **WHEREAS,** the City desires to use a large conference room in the Administration Building to  
33 serve as an emergency meeting place for the Annapolis City Council; and

35 **WHEREAS,** the parties agree that public benefits will be derived by the ability of the City  
36 Council to convene during an emergency or disaster.

40 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that the Emergency Meeting  
41 Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Annapolis and Anne Arundel County Public
