

## **Beth Dolezal 2019 Annapolis Transportation Board Resume**

Beth Dolezal is retired from the US Federal Government/US Department of Justice as a Computer Specialist/Data Systems Information Specialist. During her time at DOJ, in addition to her regular duties, she organized and ran national conferences for GITEC, Government Information Technology & Electronic Centers and FGIPC, Federal Government Information Processing Centers. She also served as President of AFFIRM, the Association for Federal Information Resources Managers. She has served in various volunteer positions for the Hammond-Harwood House, most recently as Chair for the 2017 & 2018 Secret Garden Tours. Other volunteer activities include Board member of Friends of the Annapolis Symphony where she created and chaired the fund raiser Read Between the Wines, Court Appointed Special Advocates where she served on the Gala committee, Board of the Bay Theatre Company where she upgraded their ticket system and increased annual ticket holders and paid single patrons by 50% and a Board member of First Night Annapolis. Beth joined Anne Arundel Women Giving Together, a Giving Circle, in 2014. She has served as Team Leader on the Grants Committee and Post Grants Committee. She is currently the Assistant Chair of the Grants Committee. Beth has also served as a Commissioner on the Anne Arundel County Commission for Women, the City's Parking Advisory Commission and the Sister City Program. She was a recent past member of the Annapolis Transportation Board.
