Updating the Standing Committees Section of the City Code

AMENDMENT 2 – MAYOR LITTMANN

Amendment Summary:

Ordinances are automatically assigned to the Council's standing committee based on the specific Code titles that each committee oversees. If an ordinance has changes to more than one Code title, it might be referred to two or more committees.

Amendment 2 prevents council members from requesting committee referrals if the total exceeds two referrals. *This version includes the committee referral limit, and the former Amendment 2 is now Amendment 3.*

MOTION:

On page 6, line 10 at the end of Subsection C, insert the following language:

“However, no committee chair may request the referral of legislation that has already been referred to two standing committees.”

- B. Each of the committees as enumerated in this section shall have other and further duties and responsibilities as are designated to them by the City Council. The Mayor may designate any other standing or special committees as the Mayor deems appropriate from time to time.
- C. In addition to automatic referrals, each committee chair may have legislation referred to their respective committee. For purposes of this section, “automatic referrals” shall be defined as the process by which amendments to titles listed under each standing committee are automatically referred to that committee, as outlined in Section A above. However, no committee chair may request the referral of legislation that has already been referred to two standing committees.

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
