- 1. Boards and Commissions: The Community Engagement Administrator's salary and benefits were erroneously omitted from the FY2023 adopted budget.
- 2. Office of Law: Legal expenses were greater than anticipated.
- 3. Management Information Technology: The projected overage is due tochanges to employees' benefit selections.
- 4. R&P Pip Moyer Salaries and benefits: The Department overspent its budget and an employee from the Parking Fund was trasferred to Pip Moyer.
- 5. R&P Pip Moyer Contractual Services: Electricity costs were greater than anticipated.
- 6. R&P Administration: Former employee leave payout and VEBA chop costs.
- 7. R&P Stanton Center Salaries and benefits: The Department overspent its budget.
- 8. R&P Stanton Center Contractual Services: Electricity costs were greater than anticipated.
- 9. Harbormaster: The increase in dock space and use of sick leave has attributed to the overage.

 10. Self Insurance: Workers compensation and general liability claims pay outs greater than anticipated.
- 11.Transportation Operations Salaries and benefits: Projected overage is caused by additional overtime costs as a result of vacancies.
