

BILL SUMMARY: R-7-23 waives fees for two additional Annapolis St. Patrick's Day events in March. The Council approved the 2023 St. Patrick's Day Parade fee waiver last July in R-36-22. This adds the St. Patrick's Hooley on March 3 and Shamrock the Dock on March 4 and 5.

17 **A RESOLUTION** concerning

19 **Additional City-supported St. Patrick's Day Events in Fiscal Year 2023**

20
21 **FOR** the purpose of identifying City-supported events for St. Patrick's Day celebrations
22 in Annapolis; and waiving certain related City fees during Fiscal Year 2023.

23
24 **WHEREAS,** Section 14.18.020 of the City Code defines a “City-supported event” as a
25 special event for which the City:

- 26 1. Waives some or all of the fees pursuant to [Section 14.18.110](#); or
27 2. Agrees to provide financial or in-kind support and be identified as a
28 sponsor; and
29 3. Shall not be the applicant or an event organizer for the City-
30 supported event.

32 **WHEREAS,** Section 6.04.210 of the City Code states that “whenever a person leases,
33 uses or occupies a City facility, the person shall be charged and pay a
34 minimum of full fees for the use of the facility.” Examples of City
35 facilities include public spaces, grounds, parks, athletic facilities, fields,
36 docks, piers, wet slips, moorings, developable waters, buildings, motor
37 vehicles, equipment, structures, rooms or other parts of public buildings.
38 Examples of City services include traffic control, crowd control, public
39 safety support (police or fire), trash removal, sanitary services, recycling,
40 bulk pick-up, the provision of water, sewer, electricity, communications or
41 other utilities, transportation, and labor. Full fees “means the value of the

1 right to lease, use or occupy the City facility as determined by the Finance
2 Director in a fiscal impact note, plus all costs incurred by the City of
3 Annapolis including, but not limited to, utility costs and costs associated
4 with municipal services (public safety, public works, custodial,
5 renovations, repairs, maintenance, transportation and parking)”; and

7 **WHEREAS,** Section 6.04.210 of the City Code further states that the fees for City
8 Services may be waived “by resolution of the City Council under
9 guidelines approved by the City Council.”

11 **NOW, THEREFORE,**

12 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that the following
13 special events are designated City-supported Events during Fiscal Year 2023 in
14 recognition of their significance to our heritage and public service to our City:

- 15 • The St. Patrick's Hooley (March 3)
- 16 • Shamrock the Dock (March 4 and March 5)

18 **AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that
19 there shall be a waiver of certain fees for the designated City-supported Events identified
20 in the staff report attached to this resolution and incorporated herein by reference.

22 **AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that
23 this resolution shall take effect from the date of its passage.
