#### Good evening.

I want to share the sad news that Theodore Gray, a retired mason with the Department of Public Works, recently passed away. Mr. Gray retired from the City in April of 2016. His service will be held tomorrow at Lasting Tributes on Bestgate Road. We send our best wishes to the family and his friends.

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As we meet tonight, I also want to acknowledge that there are people in other parts of the world, suffering and dying in the midst of conflict and war. Our hearts go out to them. We hope and pray for an end to conflict so that all children everywhere can grow up in peace, and with dignity and freedom.

Sometimes we can become consumed with our local problems and different points of view. But seeing the suffering in other parts of the world reminds us how lucky we are. Let it also be a reminder to us that with goodwill, constructive dialogue and a little compromise, almost every problem can be solved and every difference resolved.
