City Council Nominations to Boards, Commissions, and Committees

AMENDMENT 1 – ALD. SAVIDGE

Amendment Summary:

This amendment clarifies which boards, commissions, and committees the O-3-24 applies to and that the position must be vacant six months or longer without an appointment made by the Mayor.

On page 2, in line 4, insert the following paragraph "C":

"C. **Exceptions.** The City Council shall not have the authority to make nominations to the board of appeals, planning commission, or any other board, commission, or committee that Maryland law specifies shall be made by the Mayor, who is the City's local executive."

On page 1, in line 42, strike "longer than six months." And after "for" insert "six months or longer without a candidate being approinted."

As the change would look in the resolution:

- A. While the Mayor has the primary authority to make appointments, City Council members may individually nominate candidates for boards, commissions, and committees to fill positions:
 - 1. Vacant longer than six months; or
 - 2. Expired and filled with an acting member for longer than six months or longer without a candidate being appointed.
- B. The nomination shall be for review and consent through a vote of the full Council:
 - 1. Offered via resolution on First Reader; and
 - 2. Confirmed by the City Council following the Second Reader of the resolution.
- C. Exceptions. The City Council shall not have the authority to make nominations to the board of appeals, planning commission, or any other board, commission, or committee that Maryland law specifies shall be made by the Mayor, who is the City's local executive.
