The NAM program was started in 2018, to create public awareness and community engagement in African American(Black) neighborhoods with significant historical fatal opioid overdoses.

In 2023, NO HARM received funding from the Annapolis
United Youth Diversion
Program to create and implement the school-based
Annapolis Youth Options
Initiative at Annapolis High and Annapolis Middle School.

This funding has enabled NO HARM to hire additional staff and expand engagement and outreach to more children, adults, and families. It also enabled us to expand out CSR Pop Up Tour

The goal of our Community Services and Resources Initiative is to connect neighborhoods with city and agency service providers by "meeting people where they are."

Community Services and Resources Initiative Achievements:

- We conducted a 14-week pop-up tour from July 11, 2024, to October 10, 2024 (expanded from eight weeks in 2023)
- Engaged with over 1,500 residents from 14 underserved neighborhoods in Annapolis city.
- Partnered with over 30 vendors across the City of Annapolis and Anne Arundel County to provide essential resources and services, to include APD, AFD, OEM, and OCS
