Title: Speed Monitoring System Fines

Date: September 2, 2025

This resolution updates the FY 2026 City of Annapolis Fines Schedule for Speed Monitoring Systems, in alignment with House Bill 182, which repealed the former \$40 cap on speed camera fines and established a tiered fine structure based on the severity of the speed offense. 2024 data provided by RedSpeed, based on the City's existing sites, illustrates a high volume of speed violations. Based on the study results summarized below, the City could initially anticipate additional annual fine revenue of approximately \$1,472,200. This calculation is based on FY24 violation data, without consideration of realized decrease in violations with passage of time.
