20 **A RESOLUTION** concerning

22 **Comprehensive Maritime Review**

24 **FOR** the purpose of conducting a comprehensive economic and zoning review of all
25 maritime zones.

26
27 **WHEREAS,** the 1998 Comprehensive Plan recommended that the City “[m]aintain the
28 existing Maritime zones and evaluate whether any changes are needed to
29 strengthen the Maritime industry”; and
30

31 **WHEREAS,** the 2009 Comprehensive Plan recommended that the City “strive to ensure
32 the Maritime Industry’s sustained health and viability”; and
33

34 **WHEREAS,** the 2013 City Dock Master Plan, as an amendment to the 2009
35 Comprehensive Plan, requires that any “rezoning [other than WMC]
36 should be consistent with the recommendations of a new Zoning And
37 Economic Maritime Sector Study covering all of the current Maritime
38 Districts in the city; and

40 **WHEREAS,** the Maritime Advisory Board has consistently recommended that any
41 change to any Maritime Zone be undertaken as part of a comprehensive
42 review of all Maritime Zones; and

44 **WHEREAS,** the report of the Maritime Development Subcommittee of the 2014
45 Transition Team recommended a comprehensive review of maritime
46 zoning; and

2 **WHEREAS,** the Maritime Advisory Board has requested that the City Council approve
3 a comprehensive review of all maritime zones.

6 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL**
7 that the Director of Planning and Zoning shall commence and complete on or before May
8 15, 2016, in cooperation with the Maritime Advisory Board, a comprehensive review of
9 all maritime zones, and shall make recommendations to the Mayor and City Council as to
10 what, if any, changes are necessary to strengthen the maritime industry and to ensure the
11 maritime industry's sustained health and viability.
