Ward 2 Responses (YTD 2025)

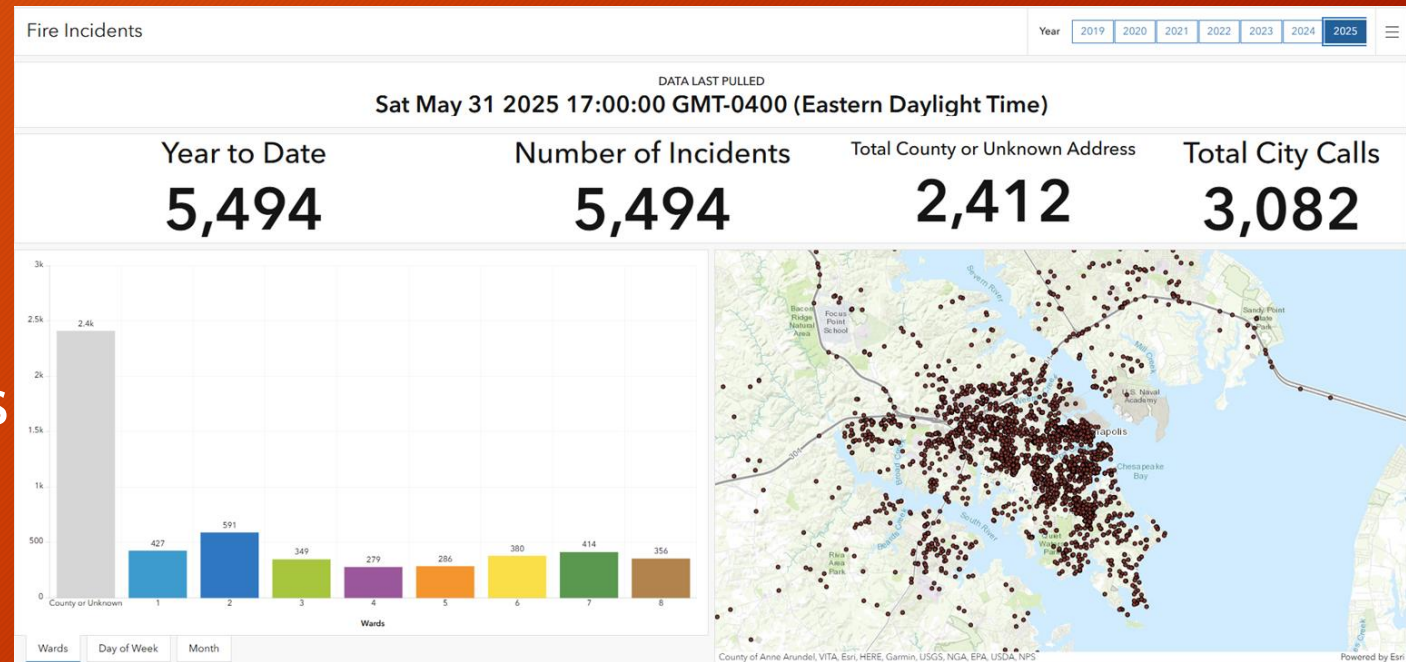


YTD 2025 (as of 05.31.2025)

CY2022 - \$1,085,197

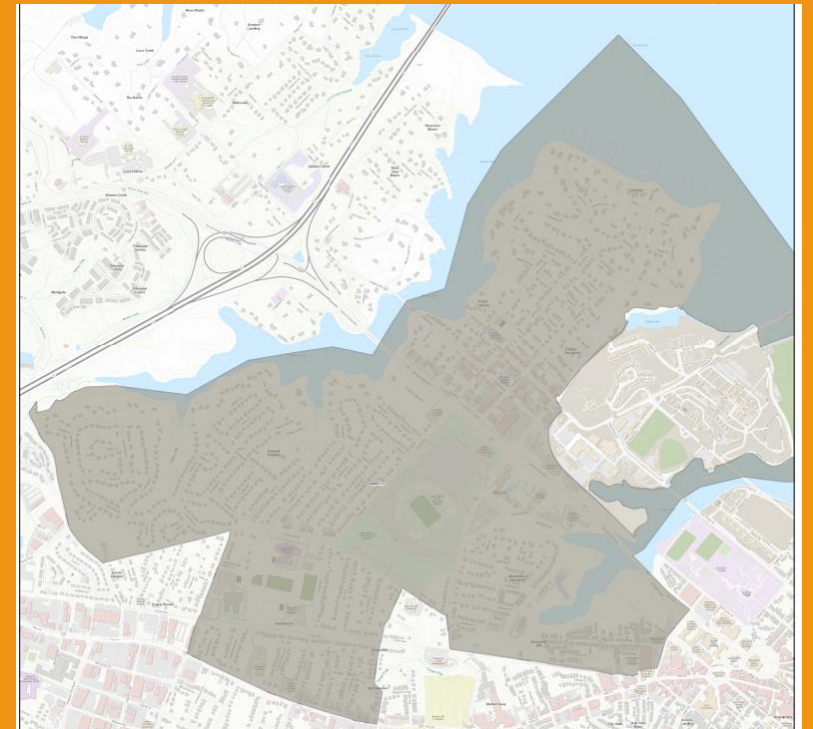
CY2023 - \$2,754,144
