


Harbormaster: Mission

Recent Accomplishments

- Restored 2006 Zodiac--new bright blue tubes and a new 150 HP Yamaha



- Purchased 2018 Everglades 24 foot center console--Replaced 2001 diesel hybrid



Accomplishments Continued

- Secured a grant for 76K for a new efficient pump-out boat, cheaper to maintain, and more reliable.
- Used a 25K grant from DNR to remove 13 large derelict vessels, 2 derelict dinghies
- Evicted 6 people from city waters for repeated violations
- Increased revenue 11.4 %- a sum equal to almost 62K
- Stepped up enforcement efforts resulting in 100% compliance for regular sewage pump-outs for all live aboard boaters

Sources of Revenue

- 76 Public Rental Moorings
- Up to 60 Annual Mooring Permits
- 1,500 feet of Bulkhead Space
- 18 Slips at City Dock
- Commercial Leases—(Watermark and others)
- Boat Ramp—Truxton
