26	WHE	REAS,	in 2016, the Chesapeake Bay Commission championed the notion of
27			designating the second week of June as Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week;

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30	WHEREAS,		legislation establishing the special week has been enacted in Virginia,
31			Maryland and Pennsylvania; and
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33	WHEREAS,		the Chesapeake Bay is the largest and, at one time, was the most productive
34			estuary in the United States, spanning six states and the District of
35			Columbia; and

37	WHEREAS,		the Chesapeake Bay watershed is an extraordinary and vital natural
38			resource, as well as an integral part of the history and heritage of the State;

41	WHE	REAS,	
42			Susquehanna River, Potomac River, Patuxent River, Rappahannock River,
43			York River, and James River, and contains more than 15 trillion gallons of
44			water; and
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WHEREAS, according to the Chesapeake Bay Foundation, the Chesapeake Bay stretches 1 200 miles from Havre de Grace, Maryland, to Norfolk, Virginia, has an 2 average depth of 21 feet, ranges from 3.4 miles to 35 miles wide, supports 3 more than 300 species of finfish, more than 170 species of shellfish, more 4 than 3,600 species of plant and animal life, including 2,700 types of plants, 5 and more than 16 species of underwater grasses; and 6 7 **WHEREAS**, the Chesapeake Bay area is home to more than 17 million people, many of 8 whom rely on the Bay for their livelihood and recreational activities; and 9 10 WHEREAS, as an important source of food for the State and the East Coast of the United 11 States, the Chesapeake Bay produces more than 500 million pounds of 12 13 seafood harvest each year; and 14 **WHEREAS**, there are many issues that detrimentally affect the health of the Chesapeake 15 Bay, one of which is polluted runoff: rain water that runs off our streets, 16 parking lots, lawns, and other surfaces, picking up pet waste, pesticides, 17 fertilizer, oil, and other contaminants, which flush straight into local creeks, 18 rivers, and the Chesapeake Bay, adversely affecting water quality and 19 aquatic life; and 20 21 currents of runoff scour stream banks, destabilize the natural contours of the 22 WHEREAS streams, and even alter their depths; and 23 24 25 eroded dirt from runoff blocks sunlight from reaching underwater grasses. WHEREAS smothers the aquatic homes of oysters and other life, kills grasses and 26 marine life, imperils fish and other creatures that rely on them, and carries 27 nutrients that spur algae blooms that cause low oxygen and kill fish; and 28 29 WHEREAS runoff is one of the main reasons the Bay remains on the "dirty waters" list 30 of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA); and 31 32 WHEREAS, there are several proven strategies that residents and communities can 33 implement to absorb runoff and reduce the risk of routine flooding and 34 damage from polluted runoff, including: planting trees, creating vegetated 35 areas ("rain gardens"), installing porous driveway parking, installing roofs 36 with plants that drink up rain ("green roofs"), installing "rain barrels" to 37 38 collect rain from roof downspouts, and use it on landscaping, and 39 40 WHEREAS, the rich history, pivotal economic importance, and astounding beauty of the 41 Chesapeake Bay watershed never cease to amaze residents and visitors alike; and 42 43
