21 **A RESOLUTION** concerning

22 **An Ad Hoc Committee to Study the 2013 Municipal Election and Make Recommendations,**  
23 **If Needed, to Improve the City Code, Structure, and Procedures for City Elections**

25 **FOR** the purpose of establishing an ad hoc committee to study the 2013 municipal election  
26 and make recommendations, if needed, to improve the City Code, structure, and  
27 procedures for elections in the City of Annapolis.

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29 **WHEREAS,** the 2013 City election for Mayor and for Alderman of Ward 2 were decided by  
30 absentee and provisional ballots. The narrow margins in both these races  
31 focused the community's attention on the process for providing, processing,  
32 validating and counting a few hundred absentee and provisional ballots; and

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34 **WHEREAS,** the City of Annapolis recognizes, in particular, the Voting Rights Act of 1965 as  
35 a landmark piece of legislation that prohibits discrimination in voting, and  
36 therefore, the City of Annapolis abhors any efforts that would inhibit or thwart or  
37 any attempt to inhibit or thwart any person who proceeds to legitimately  
38 exercise his or her right to vote; and

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40 **WHEREAS,** the chairs of both Central Committees have called on the City Council to  
41 conduct an investigation into the 2013 City election; and

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43 **WHEREAS,** the City Council believes that the issues and concerns that were identified in  
44 the aftermath of the November 5, 2013 election deserve additional attention  
45 and consideration. Those issues include but are not limited to:

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- 1 • Procedures for notifying voters of their correct precinct and polling place, particularly
- 2 after new districts are drawn.
- 3 • Procedures for training election judges on their responsibilities for cooperating with poll
- 4 watchers representing candidates and campaigns.
- 5 • Procedures for training election judges on their responsibility to provide provisional
- 6 ballots to voters who show up at polling places believing they are registered to vote but
- 7 are not listed on the voter rolls.
- 8 • Procedures for allowing election judges to vote at the precinct where they work.
- 9 • Procedures governing poll watchers, including their training and responsibilities to work
- 10 with election judges.
- 11 • Procedures for notifying the public of the deadlines for registering to vote for both the
- 12 primary and general elections.
- 13 • Procedures for notifying voters that they are ineligible to vote if they register after the
- 14 deadline.
- 15 • Procedures for notifying voters of the deadlines for requesting an absentee ballot, and
- 16 for returning the ballot.
- 17 • Procedures for notifying voters if their application is incomplete and allowing them to
- 18 correct their application.
- 19 • Procedures for informing voters that once they receive an absentee ballot they cannot
- 20 vote at the polls, even if they do not return the absentee ballot.
- 21 • Procedures for documenting and date stamping absentee ballots once they are returned,
- 22 whether by mail or in person at City Hall.
- 23 • Procedures for sealing an absentee ballot before it is returned, including the use of tape
- 24 if the seal on the ballot is insufficient to keep the ballot closed.
- 25 • Procedures for informing voters of their right to vote by provisional ballot if they show up
- 26 to vote and are not listed on the voter rolls.
- 27 • Procedures for documenting receipt of provisional ballots.
- 28 • Procedures for disqualifying absentee and provisional ballots.
- 29 • Procedures for ensuring that election judges are trained and willing to cooperate with
- 30 established rules and procedures.
- 31 • Procedures for ensuring campaign compliance with City code, contribution limits and
- 32 reporting.

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34 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that an ad hoc  
35 committee is established, consisting of 11 members as follows:

- 36 • The Annapolis Democratic Central Committee shall name one co-chair and 4 additional
- 37 members.
- 38 • The Annapolis Republican Central Committee shall name one co-chair and 4 additional
- 39 members.
- 40 • The Mayor shall solicit nominations for members with no political party or are registered
- 41 independents, and from said nominations shall select one member.

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43 **AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that the ad hoc  
44 committee shall convene a public hearing with proper notice and take written and oral testimony  
45 from voters, the candidates, their campaigns, the lawyers who represented the campaigns, the  
46 City Clerk's office and experts on voting practices and procedures to document the actual  
47 experiences of voters, understand current practices and procedures and make  
48 recommendations to the Election Board, the Mayor and the City Council to address voter issues  
49 and concerns.
