Subject to NFPA review, an alternate suppression system may be approved if the Department determines that a wet sprinkler system cannot be 16 17 installed without jeopardizing any historic components and the existing fabric of the 18 building. Applications to install alternate suppression systems are not eligible to receive 19 assistance from the sprinkler revolving fund. 20 D. Responsibility of Property Owner. The property owner shall pay for installation of the entire 21 fire sprinkler system, including the lateral from the water main into the building. For 22 purposes of this chapter, all tapping of water mains shall be performed in accordance with 23 Section 16.04.010 of the City Code. 24 25 A. **Applicability.** 26 1. All commercial, mixed-use, and residential buildings other than a single-family 27 house located on Main Street and Francis Street in the Historic District shall 28 install sprinkler systems. 29 2. If the building is adjacent to existing underground lateral lines, sprinkler systems 30 shall be installed no later than February 28, 2027. 31 3. If the building benefits from installing adjacent underground lateral lines after
