### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation Mission

#### **Public Transit**

To provide the highest possible level of reliable, safe, interconnected, customer-focused, affordable, accessible and efficient public transportation throughout the Annapolis area to enhance quality of life, support the environment and economic development.

#### **Parking**

To provide customer-focused, equitable and quality parking services through the enforcement of the city's parking regulations and management of its parking garages.

#### **Planning**

To provide comprehensive transportation planning and analysis for both motorized and non-motorized transportation modes consistent with the city's land use policies for improved mobility at a satisfactory level of service with minimal community disruption and environmental impacts.

#### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation Transit Services

**Objective: Improve transit service reliability** 

On Time Performance (OTP):

Baseline: 85% OTP of transit vehicles.

- Status (FY2020): Fixed Route OTP (89%), ADA (100%)
- Status (FY2021): Fixed Route OTP (94%), ADA (100%)

#### **Objective: Improve customer satisfaction**

Baseline: 10 validated complaints per 100,000 boardings (0.01%)

- Status (FY2020): 0.0029%
- Status (FY2021): 0.0053%

#### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation Transit Services

### Objective: Maintain a safe and reliable transit fleet that is 100% wheelchair accessible

- Status (FY2020/21) 100% adherence to wheel chair access and ramp requirements.
- Status (FY2020/21): 100% adherence to preventative maintenance schedule.

#### **COVID-19 Safety Initiatives**

- Installation of driver barriers on all vehicles.
- Installation of seatback sneeze guards.
- Vehicles cleaned and sanitized daily.

#### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation Transit Services

#### Long Term Goal: Improve Bus Stop amenities and accessibility.

Status: Continue upgrades to Google Maps to include all ADOT bus stops.

- Develop a program to replace bus stop signs with a more uniform sign.
- Install bus route maps in all bus shelters.
- Develop mobile phone access to bus routes and schedules.

#### **Long Term Goal: Service Expansion on Select Routes**

- Implement micro transit service.
- Incorporate on-demand, dynamic routing and scheduling.

### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation Parking Services

Objective: Enforce on-street parking regulations equitably and consistently

85% of RPP Districts covered by daily enforcement (status: 100%)

95% parking meter compliance and working order. (status: 99%)

#### **Objective: On-time resolution of customer complaints**

95% response to all valid customer complaints within two days (status: 100%)

#### Objective: Improve collection and clearance rates of parking violations

85% collection rate on issued violations (Status 80%)

90% clearance of issued violations collected (Status 85%)

### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation Parking Services

Long Term Goal: Increase access to parking payment options by implementing "app" payments and access.

Single-space meters being replaced with multi-space kiosks and Parkmobile app.

Long Term Goal: Ensure garages are accessible and revenue maximized by replacing access control equipment.

CIP project awaiting implementation to replace access control equipment at Gotts Garage, Knighton Garage and Larkin Lot.

Long Term Goal: Ensure adequate parking downtown by replacing Hillman Garage.

Hillman Garage project underway.

# City of Annapolis Department of Transportation FY2021 Changes/Improvements

#### **Transit Services**

- Acquisition of two heavy duty buses.
- Replacement of Garage 'Sky Lifts' for vehicle maintenance
- Development and implementation of new FTA mandated Safety Management System Plan.
- Free Fares for Students K-12
  - 10,076 students since 2018.
  - 3,867 in FY2019
  - 6,069 in FY2020
  - 140 in FY 2021 (through March 2021); reduction due to virtual schooling

### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation FY2021 Changes/Improvements

#### **Parking Services**

- Work with parking contractor to rebrand the Circulator service to attract more riders as we prepare for major downtown construction projects.
- Install multi-space parking meter kiosks to replace single inoperable and aging single-space meters.
- Continue implementation of Park Mobile application. Since implementation there have been 142,236 users; 519,253 transactions.
- Implement capital project to replace access control equipment at Knighton, Gotts Court and Larkin Lot.


### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation COVID-19 Transit Impacts - Ridership

70.67% ridership reduction in FY 2021 compared to FY2020 in same time period




### City of Annapolis Department of Transportation COVID-19 Impacts – Transit Fare Revenues


30.54% reduction in fare revenue in FY 2021 compared for FY 2020 in the same time period



Reduction in all areas in first 9 months in FY 2021 compared to same period in FY 2020:

- Vehicle parking in garages/lots: -64.3%
- Citations: -26.1%
- Meters: -53.1%
- Revenues (garages, lots, citations/meters): -44%
