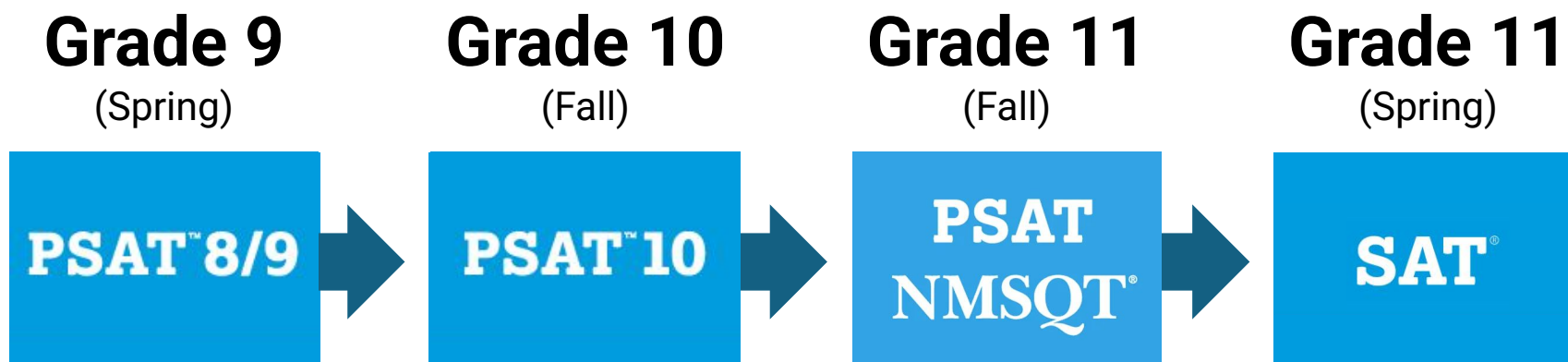


**Gains in Percentage of Possible Points Earned

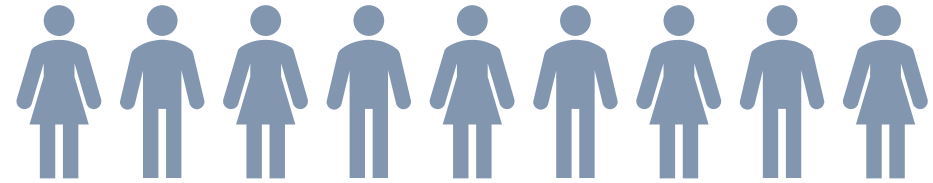

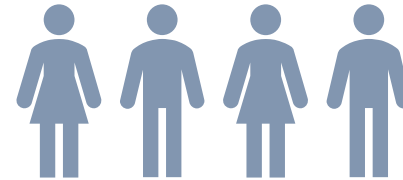

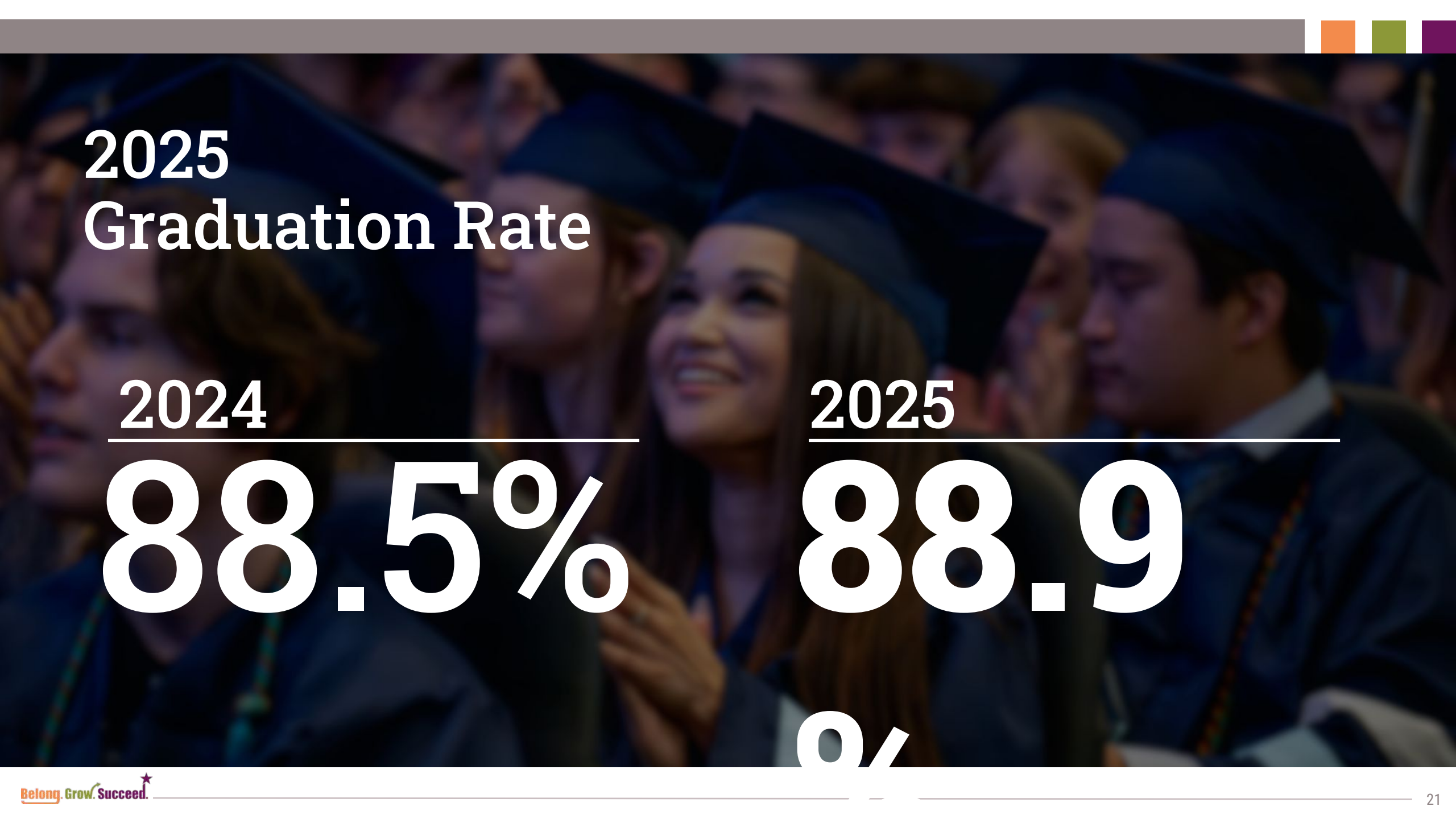
