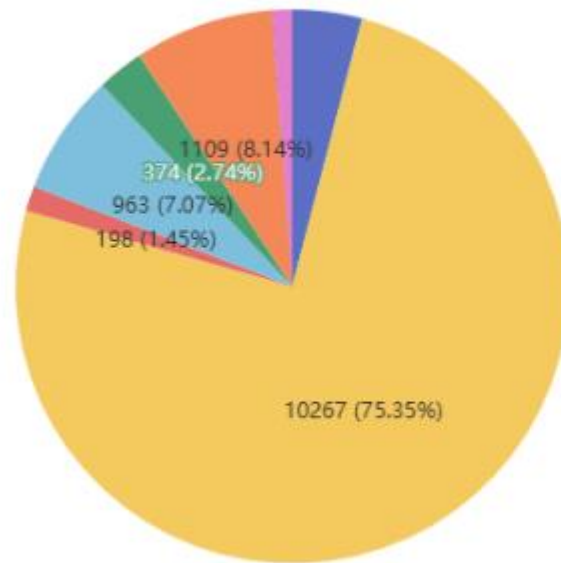




# Calendar Year (CY) 2024 City-Wide Responses

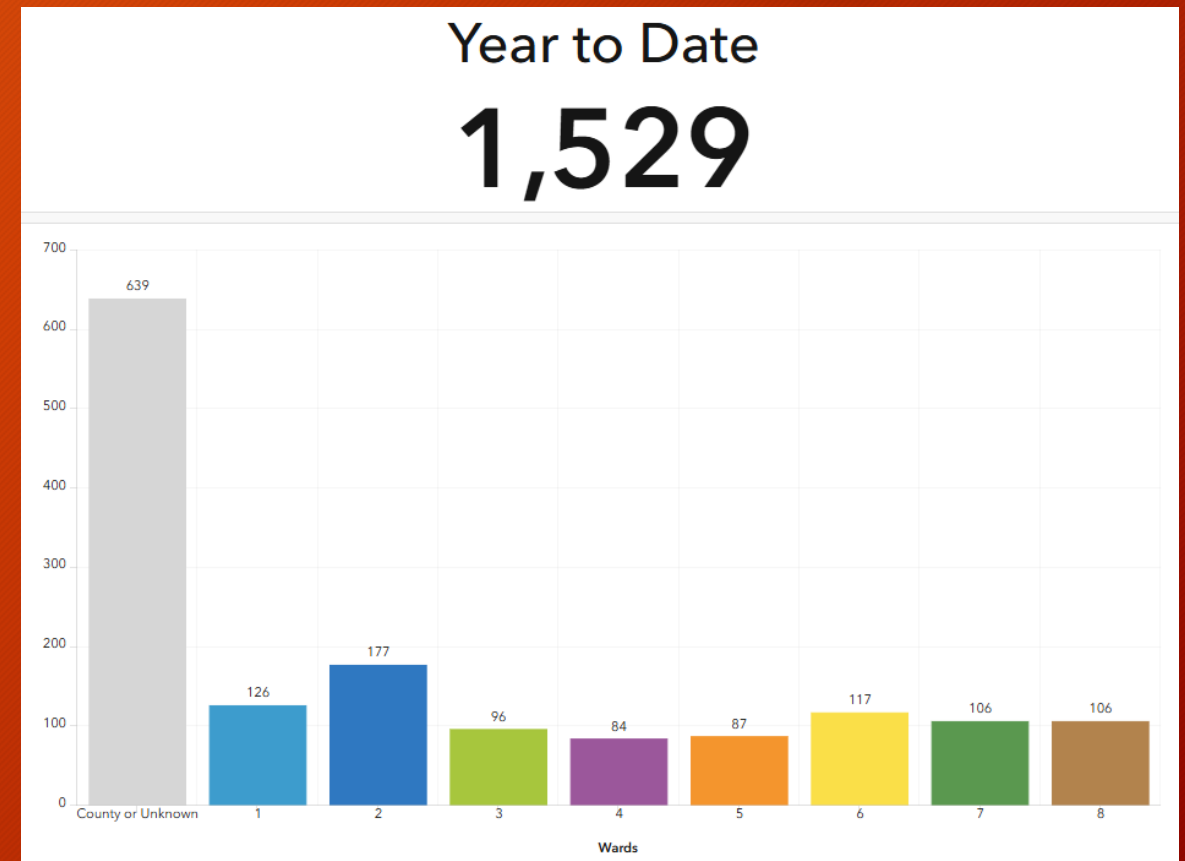


YTD 2025 (as of 02.28.2025)

# Calendar Year (CY) 2024 City-Wide Responses

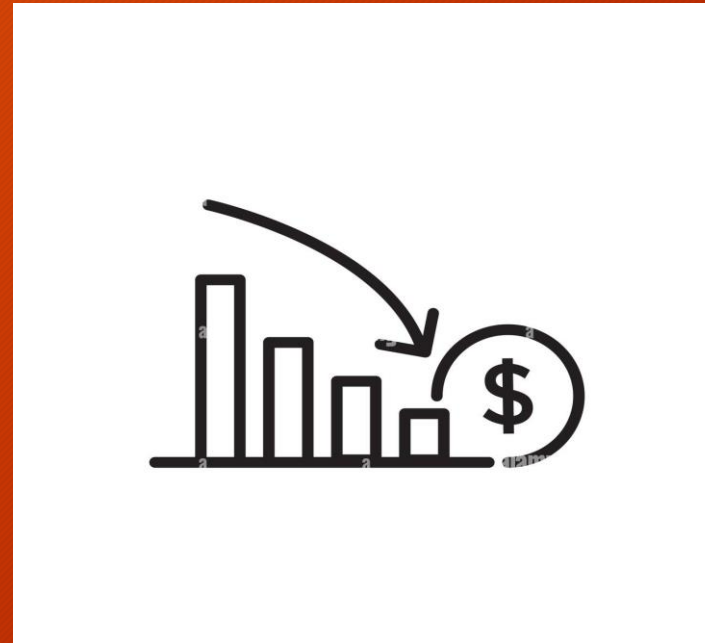


## Loss valuation trends -

CY2023 - \$2,754,144

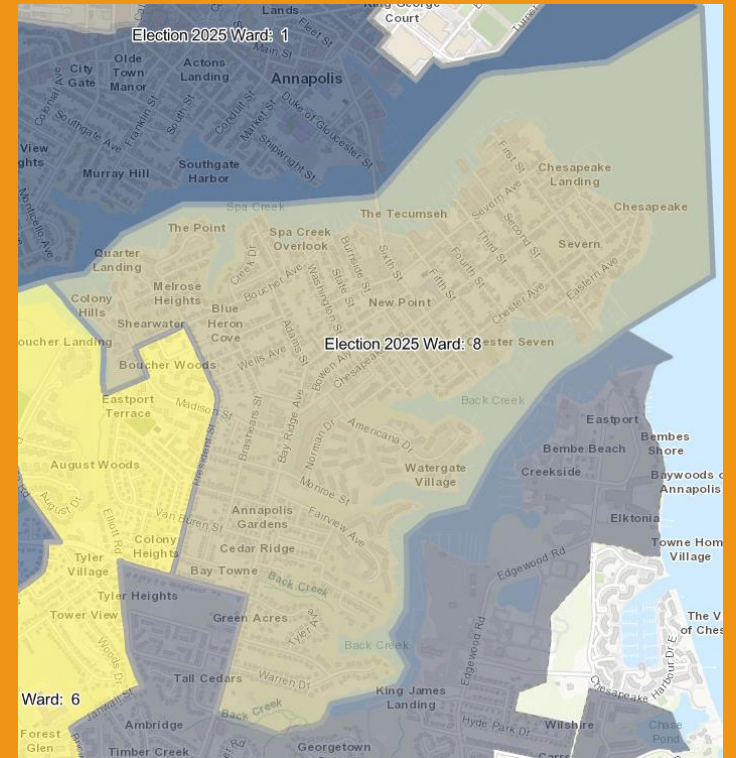
CY2024 - \$450,520
