3 C.	For a school facility, mitigation consists of the construction or funding of improvements by
4	a developer that increase capacity of the school facility which, at the time of application, is
5	below the minimum standard in the impact area so that the capacity of the facility in the
6	scheduled completion year is equal to, or greater than, it would have been had the
7	development not been constructed. A mitigation plan with physical improvements may be
8	secured by bond, letter of credit or other security acceptable to the City and shall be
9	provided under an agreement with the Board of Education to construct school facilities,
10	including contract schools. The developer shall submit a cost estimate to establish the value
11	of construction offered in mitigation in conformance with City specifications. Capital
12	improvements to any portion of the developer's property or project, pursuant to a school
13	capacity mitigation agreement, shall be made available and shall provide school capacity to
14	allow approval of preliminary subdivision plan applications that are filed within six years of
15	the date of the school capacity mitigation agreement.
16 <u>D.</u>	If the Chief of Police determines that a planned development or redevelopment would
