# **Streets - Turtle-friendly curbs**

# **AMENDMENT 1 – Savidge Substitute Amendment**

**AMENDMENT SUMMARY:** Further limits 1) where turtle-friendly curbs would be required in new construction and 2) where the City would be required to replace existing curbs with new curbs that are turtle friendly.

#### **DETAILS:**

- Definitions are expanded & include "Critical Area"
- Titles are added to each subsection, and subsections are numbered
- Turtle-friendly curbs are limited to area areas within the critical area that meet the following criteria: within 250' adjacent to a Resource Conservation Area (Critical area designation), 250' of a City park, 250' of a forest conservation easement, or other area designated by P&Z
- On existing curbs in those areas, turtle-friendly replacement curbs are required only if the existing curb is at least a block, or 400-feet, long.
- Gives the Public Works director the ability to waive the requirement if needed.

On page 2, strike lines 3 through 20, and replace with the following:

#### TURTLE-FRIENDLY CURBS.

- 1. **PURPOSE.** TO PROTECT CRITICAL AND ENDANGERED NATIVE MARYLAND TERRAPINS AND TURTLES, THE CITY REQUIRES:
  - a. TURTLE-FRIENDLY CURBS IN NEW CONSTRUCTION AND CERTAIN REPLACEMENT PROJECTS;

  - ii. OTHER AREA DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN THE CITY'S CRITICAL AREA DEFINED IN TITLE 17 § 04.180.

- 3. CURB REPLACEMENT.
  - a. WHEN DEVELOPING A STREET REPLACEMENT PROGRAM IN THE AREAS DESCRIBED IN § 01.020 OF THIS TITLE, THE DIRECTOR SHALL REQUIRE EXISTING CURB TO BE REPLACED WITH TURTLE-FRIENDLY CURBS WHERE EXISTING CURBING MEETS THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:
    - i. IS MORE THAN ONE BLOCK; OR
    - ii. IS A SECTION OF AT LEAST 400 FEET LONG
  - b. THE DIRECTOR MAY WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT IF SUCH A WAIVER IS IN THE INTEREST OF PUBLIC SAFETY OR OTHER MITIGATING CIRCUMSTANCES.
- 4. TYPES OF CURBS. TURTLE-FRIENDLY CURBS SHALL CONSIST OF:
  - a. SLANTED/SLOPED CURB, ALSO KNOWN AS A MOUNTABLE CURB; OR
  - b. ANGLED CURBS: OR
  - c. OTHER TYPE OF CURB ALLOWING TURTLES AND TERRAPINS TO EXIT THE STREET.

TURTLE-FRIENDLY CURBS.-IN AN EFFORT TO PROTECT CRITICAL AND ENDANGERED NATIVE MARYLAND TERRAPINS AND TURTLES, THE CITY REQUIRES CERTAIN TYPES OF CURBS IN NEW CONSTRUCTION ALONG NON-ARTERIAL, CITY-OWNED AND/OR MAINTAINED STREETS LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY'S CRITICAL AREA DEFINED IN TITLE 17 § 04.180.

- 1. THE CURBS SHALL CONSIST OF:

  a. SLANTED/SLOPED CURB, ALSO KNOWN AS A MOUNTABLE CURB; OR

  b. ANGLED CURBS; OR

  c. OTHER TYPE OF CURB ALLOWING TURTLES AND TERRAPINS TO EXIT THE STREET.
  - 2. THE DIRECTOR SHALL DEVELOP AND ADHERE TO A NEW CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE FOR REPLACING EXISTING CURBS WITH TURTLE FRIENDLY CURBS AS DEFINED IN THIS SECTION, TITLE 14 § 01.020."
