This Requirement may be satisfied either by formal training in one or more of these fields or active membership in a preservation-related organization. The requirement for membership under the category of specific knowledge may be satisfied by formal post secondary education, employment or practical experience in one or more of the above-listed fields.

The work of the Historic Preservation Commission requires that we make decisions following two often conflicting directives: to support the economic life of the city, and to preserve the beauty and historic capital that we inherited and have to pass on intact. As a newspaper and magazine correspondent, I've often spent time in towns like Annapolis, talking to city officials about economic development and trying to understand what kinds of development programs best help a city thrive. At the same time, I'm currently in my third year of a PhD in financial history, working on the history of finance and money. Part of my dissertation takes place in Annapolis, home of the first printed American dollar. (Really!) When I was in high school, I gave historic tours of the city, a skill I learned from my grandmother. I understand how important it is to retain the character of this city, and that at literally every address downtown there's a three-hundred-year story to tell.

The Almighty Dollar (2019 - present)

Writing a 500-year history of the dollar for Penguin Random House, scheduled to be published in early 2025.

Princeton University (2021 - present)

Currently in third year of six-year **PhD in the history of finance** at the Department of History. Serve as **coordinator for the Economic History Workshop**. Have **contributed papers** to conferences on the history of money and finance at Harvard Law School, the Heinrich Böll Stiftung in Berlin, and the Hoover Institution.

Financial Times (2018 - present)

As **Contributing Editor**, write regular opinion pieces on the Federal Reserve and monetary history. As the **US Economics Editor**, served as main Federal Reserve correspondent. Covered the Fed's decision to expand its balance sheet to preserve the repo market in 2019, its year-long fundamental reassessment of monetary policy, and the emergency responses to the pandemic. As **US Editor** for *FT Alphaville*, wrote about wages, modern monetary theory, climate models and, oddly, several major marine disasters.

Bloomberg (2010 - 2017)

Covered the 2016 cycle as **US elections economic policy correspondent**. Traveled to Rhode Island to write about trade, Arkansas to write about how disability insurance functions as employment insurance. Got religion on deep bipartisan inadequacy of US understanding of the consequences of trade. Got up every morning at 3am as a **host of Bloomberg Surveillance** to spend two hours on TV talking to macroeconomic strategists, academic economists and politicians. Got a haircut, learned how to dress myself. Stopped eating carbs. Wrote features as an **economics correspondent** for *Bloomberg Businessweek* magazine. Cover features included a 2012 dispute on austerity between Paul Krugman and the President of Estonia, a 2013 profile of the finance minister of Ireland, and "Why Bin Laden Lost," which won the New York Press Club award for special event reporting in 2012.

The Economist (2007 - 2010)

Created a new beat, **Technology Policy Correspondent**, looking at how technology affects policy, law and culture. Helped develop, write editorial lines on internet freedom, packet neutrality and spam. As **Multimedia Editor**, created the multimedia department. Developed editorial processes and standards, built studios, and integrated multimedia into existing print departments. Placed three new video programs and four new audio programs in iTunes' top 100 for News & Politics.

Public radio (2004 - 2007)

On-air presence as "**Blogger in Chief**" of a national, public-radio daily talk show. Show was awarded a grant from the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation. As **Site Editor** of the Public Radio Exchange, helped public radio stations showcase more independent productions. Built close partnerships with program and news directors at public radio stations around the country.

Freelance (1997 - 2004)

Wrote freelance for *The New York Times*, *The New York Times Magazine* and *The Wall Street Journal Europe*. Started a consulting business ghostwriting for the reinsurance industry. Translated contemporary German playwrights into English, with plays produced at Cherry Lane Theater, Actors' Playhouse and The Juilliard School.
