The Board notes that local marinas are not full and are making daily deals for overnight vessels at rates below the City's proposed fees, thereby driving those that can least afford the fee to alternate venues, as well as competing for the larger vessels.	
visit lo	What is overlooked when just focusing on docking fees is the broader impact of the g boater. A vessel docking at City Dock will invariably discharge its passengers ashore to each businesses; driving them to Chesapeake Harbor or elsewhere will result in a loss of evenue.
	Lastly, this proposed increase again will send the wrong message to visiting yachtsmen me when, in the most recent Annapolis Citizen Survey (Fall, 2013), the Maritime Industry ated by 64% of the respondents as "Critical" or "Very Important".
