Theodore "Ted" Mack is Chair of the Maryland Commission on African American History and Culture, and serves on the Executive Board of the Reginald F. Lewis Museum. He is a founding member of the Northern Arundel Cultural Preservation Society that captured the history of African Americans in Northern Anne Arundel County from 1850 to present. He coordinated the building of the award winning historic exhibit, "Trails, Tracks, Tarmac". He serves on the President's Committee for the Morgan State University Choir.

Ted is a native of Memphis, Tennessee. He attended Hampton Institute, and has a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from Mount Saint Mary's College in Emmetsburg, MD. He served over 35 years in the US Army. His military career highlights include Chief of the Army Counterintelligence Agency Terrorism Team. His vast background includes photography, Army Security Agency leadership and communications training, Personnel Management, Commander, Foreign Service (Attaché), and Computer Security. He is a charter member and the first to be inducted into the Military Intelligence Hall of Fame while on active duty. He is a two time recipient of the Legion of Merit Medal.
