Summary of Proposed Changes to 7.40 Hawkers, Peddlers, & Itinerant Merchants 0-8-16

Relations to Other Code:

Exemptions vs Allowed Without License:

Present code exempts certain activities from all regulation under Chapter 7.40, including hours and areas of operation. The only requirement is that the eligible hawker, peddler, or itinerant merchant register with the City Clerk. The proposed code eliminates both the exemption and the requirement to register. A somewhat modified list of activities will be allowed without needing to contact City Government, but will be regulated by other parts of Chapter 7.40 such as time and noise constraints:
