Jacqueline Wells, 203 Bloomsbury Square, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 representing the Annapolis Housing Authority Board of Commissioners spoke on safety, living in a secure environment, shootings and fatalities, the war on crime in the community, the ACLU, HACA's Security Plan and requested funding for needed resources. Loise Novochadlo Teliaferro, 3118 Munz Drive, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 representing the Monarch Academy spoke on learning opportunities, Hispanic and Latino Families and requested the council's support of the project. Dr. Beverly Jimenez, 41 Solomons Island Road, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke on crowding in the Annapolis area schools, being a member of the Monarch Academy Board, the proposed Monarch Academy in Annapolis, the recycling of the old Capital Building, dental health and requested that the city council fast track the approval of the academy process.

Ronni Grimes, 8415 Garfield Avenue, Severn, Maryland 21144 representing Monarch Annapolis spoke in favor of the academy, being proud members of the Monarch Academy and being an employee of Anne Arundel County Public Schools. Arnold Smith, 312 Garden Gate Lane, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke on being a member of the Board of Supervisors of Elections and Chairman of the Board of Appeals for the Annapolis Housing Authority, Violent situations, losing children, policing, offering hope and solutions, requesting the city council take a ride through Newtowne Twenty, offering young men jobs and the need for work, rising together. Shaneka Henson, 2 Bricin Street, #3, Annapolis, Maryland 21403 spoke on charter schools in Anne Arundel County, eliminating the overcrowding in public schools, the Monarch Academy's Admission Criteria, local impact grants, 18.6 Million Dollars in grant Money from Maryland Live, the Nonprofit organization Hands of Hope and running for the Office of Alderwoman for Ward 6.

Susan Myers, 2299 Mt. Tabor Road, Gambrills, MD 21054 spoke on her appointment as principal of the Monarch Academy and her background with the Anne Arundel County School System.

Ratasha Harley, 909 E Royal Street, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke in support of the Monarch Academy, Mills Parole Elementary School, being a resident of Bywater, safety for children, young man being killed within feet of her front door and violent communities.

Tyra Peoples, 5874 Apartment 6, Stevens Forest Road, Columbia Maryland 21045 spoke on being a former Annapolitian, the unsolved murder of her nephew, building up neighborhoods, having family in Annapolis, crime, programs for GED, joblessness and homelessness.

Andre Atkins, 1145 Madison Street, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 representing the Housing Authority of the City of Annapolis' Recreation Advisory Board spoke on being a resident, reporting crime, being eyes and ears to the community, safety measures, the hiring of security officers, body cameras, requested immediate action from the city council regarding the murders in the area and requested a response to the issues by October 8, 2016.

Julie Hummer, 213 Cherry Hill Lane, Laurel MD 20724 VP representing Anne Arundel County Public Schools spoke on the Children's Guild, the Monarch Academy and Monarch Global and having 5 children.

Susan Hobbs, 7774 West Shore Road Pasadena, MD 21122 representing her daughter Jamie Hobbs spoke on her daughter having Down syndrome, Dr's appointments, typical peers, self esteem issues, waiting list for the Monarch Academy, learning issues and the benefit of a different type of education. Robert Eades, 32 Pleasant Street, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke on violence, gentrification, the 4th Ward, being invested, urban renewal, silent weapons, educational programs, and children on medication, 8 murders in the city, lack of education, job skills and elimination of public housing.

Jessica Pachler, 506 President Street, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke on living on President Street, Eastport Elementary School, safety, insecurity problems, action from the city council, Unity Day, gun violence, redistricting, Anne Arundel County Public School System, bussing of students to schools outside of the area, activities, after school clubs, transportation, programs being cancelled at "Pip" Moyer Recreation Center, alternative care, police and young men. Carl Snowden, 230 Garden Gate Lane, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke on the citizen turnout at the meeting, knowing your history, citizens being killed in the city, ministers and clergy, police presence, the Bywater Community, State Police, Anne Arundel County Sheriff's Department partnering with the Annapolis City's Police Department, Newtowne Twenty, Boston Heights, murders, substandard housing, crime and poverty, right to vote, 2017 City of Annapolis Municipal Elections, St. Johns College and Darnell Brown's Murder, the official homicide rate in the city, the budget reflecting the city's priorities and cameras.

Darius Stanton II, 3386 Riva Road, Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke on his degree in Environmental Science, being 24 years old, drug dealers, children not liking the way the community looks where they live, the need for jobs, the need for more trees and community gardens, eating right, the Boys & Girls Club, stepping over needles, exposure and traveling outside of the community, violent acts and the failure of the school system.

*E.* Buraka, living in a hotel in Annapolis, Maryland 21401 spoke on the City of Annapolis being small, being independent of family, having a different prospective, being a licensed therapist, his brother shooting someone in the face, Mr. Snowden, organizational value, basketball courts, playgrounds, having 3 plans, being above a program and being an investment, resources, Annapolis Youth Services Organization, public housing being a breeding ground for poverty, his family being a part of the city since the slave trade and finding the money to invest in the city.
