35 SECTION I: BE IT ESTABLISHED AND ORDAINED BY THE ANNAPOL	IS
36 CITY COUNCIL that the Code of the City of Annapolis shall be amended to read

39 TITLE 3 – HUMAN RESOURCES	
40 Chapter 3.32 – EMPLOYEE-MANAGEMENT RELATIONS	
41 Section 3.32.060 - Negotiations.	
42	
43 A. Upon recognition of an employee organization as the exclusi	ve
44 representative of the employees in an appropriate unit, the employer and the employ	
45 organization shall have the duty, through appropriate officials or their representatives,	
46 negotiate collectively and in good faith with respect to the terms and conditions	

employment of employees in the unit. To negotiate with each other in good faith shall
mean that each party shall keep the other informed on all matters within the scope of the
representation and give reasonable written notice of any action proposed to be taken.

5 B. Negotiations with an employee organization which has been accorded 6 exclusive recognition may be conducted during the duty hours of the employee 7 organization representatives involved in the negotiations, if they are employees within the 8 appropriate unit, provided their attendance does not interfere seriously with the normal 9 operations of the City and upon notice to their supervisor.

11 C. The City Manager shall act as the City's primary representative for the 12 purpose of conducting any negotiations or other relationships between any recognized 13 employee organization and the City government.

D. The parties shall begin negotiations not later than October prior to the 15 beginning of the effective fiscal year. When the parties reach agreement, they shall 16 prepare a written memorandum of such agreement and submit it to the City Council for 17 its ratification or rejection. To have the results of any agreement considered by the City 18 19 Council, that agreement must conform to the City's fiscal year or years and be submitted to the Mayor by the LATER OF THE first Monday in February APRIL OR ONE WEEK 20 21 AFTER THE DATE THAT THE COMPTROLLER OF MARYLAND PROVIDES THE CITY WITH ANTICIPATED PROPERTY TAX REVENUES FOR THE UPCOMING 22 CITY FISCAL YEAR prior to the beginning of the effective fiscal year so as to allow the 23 financial impact of any negotiations to be included in the Mayor's annual budget 24 25 submission under Section 6.16.010. However, any agreement governing the relationship between the City and any recognized employee organization shall be entered into 26 consistent with provisions of this section and all other applicable laws or ordinances of 27 the City. In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between a collective bargaining 28 agreement entered into between the City and a recognized employee organization and any 29 Federal, State or City law, the provisions of the Federal, State or City law shall prevail. 30

33 Chapter 6.16 – BUDGET

34 Section 6.16.010 - Annual City budget.

The Mayor shall submit the proposed annual operating budget, including 36 A. the impact of any labor negotiations that are ready for City Council review under Section 37 38 3.32.060, to the City Council UPON THE LATER OF THE DATE THE COMPTROLLER OF MARYLAND PROVIDES THE CITY WITH ANTICIPATED 39 PROPERTY TAX REVENUES FOR THE UPCOMING CITY FISCAL YEAR OR 110 40 41 later than the second Monday in March APRIL of each year. Upon introduction, the budget shall be referred to the Finance Committee, which shall review and may make 42 recommendations with regard to the budget and shall submit the budget, together with 43 44 any recommendations, to the City Council not later than the second Monday in May of each year; and to the Financial Advisory Commission to provide a recommendation to 45 46 the City Council on the annual operating budget.

2 Β. The annual operating budget adopted by the City Council shall provide a complete financial plan for the fiscal year and shall contain estimates of anticipated 3 4 revenues and proposed expenditures. The budget shall be divided into the following fund groups: general fund, off-street parking fund, dock fund, market house fund, 5 transportation fund, storm water management fund and refuse collection fund group, and 6 water fund and sewer fund group. The total of the anticipated revenues and any estimated 7 fund balance or retained earnings available for expenditure during the fiscal year within 8 each of the aforesaid categories shall equal or exceed the total of the proposed 9 10 expenditures within the category. Within each of the aforesaid categories, a portion of the estimated fund equity equivalent to five percent of the associated operation budget shall 11 not be appropriated. Furthermore, unless authorized by the City Council, a portion 12 13 equivalent to an additional five percent of the associated operating budget shall be comprised of cash or cash equivalents and shall not be appropriated. The budget within 14 each category will be a line-item budget. In addition, under the line items of special 15 projects and contract services there will be an itemization of the expenses to be budgeted. 16 The budget shall be a public record in the office of the Director of Finance, open to 17 public inspection during normal business hours. 18

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Section 6.16.030 - Capital improvement program and budget.

A. The Mayor shall submit a proposed capital budget for the ensuing fiscal year and a capital improvement program for the ensuing five fiscal years to the City Council and the Planning Commission UPON THE LATER OF THE DATE THE COMPTROLLER OF MARYLAND PROVIDES THE CITY WITH ANTICIPATED PROPERTY TAX REVENUES FOR THE UPCOMING CITY FISCAL YEAR OR no later than the second Monday in March APRIL of each year.

B. The proposed capital improvement program and budget shall be reviewed by the Finance Committee and a recommendation made to the City Council by the second Monday in May of each year. Upon introduction, the budget shall also be referred to the Financial Advisory Commission to provide a recommendation to the City Council on the capital improvement program and budget.

C. The proposed capital improvement program and budget shall be placed upon the agenda of the Planning Commission at its regular monthly meeting or at a special meeting. The agenda shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City seven days prior to the meeting. At this meeting, the commission may accept evidence and testimony as it may judge to be relevant to the proper consideration of the budget and program.

D. The Planning Commission shall review the proposed capital improvement
program and budget and submit its recommendations to the City Council no later than the
second Monday in May of each year.

1	E. On or before June 30th, the City Council shall approve a capital budget for
2	the ensuing fiscal year and a capital improvement program for the five fiscal years
3	following the fiscal year.
4	
5	F. No obligations of the City shall be authorized in any fiscal year for or on
6	account of any capital project not included in the capital budget.

8	SECTION II: AND BE IT FURTHER ESTABLISHED AND ORDAINED BY
9	THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL that this ordinance shall take effect from the date
10	of its passage.
