

An FY18 grant for community outreach was approved by the Finance Committee on September 5, 2017, in the amount of \$15,840 for Neighborhood Enhancement Team efforts. In May of 2018, the Governor's Office of Crime Control & Prevention (GOCCP) invited grantees to apply for supplemental funding, provided it could be spent by June 30, 2018.
APD applied for \$7,766 to acquire tracker wristbands (wristbands with embedded transmitters and batteries); RF readers; adhesive stickers for car and home; and tailored identification cards.
The goal is to aid families who care for adults or children with special needs, like non-verbal skills, cognitive disorders, or conditions like dementia, by providing technology to quickly locate the loved one when he/she wanders away. A companion goal is to aid individuals who have non-verbal skills or other issues that could affect transactions with law enforcement by providing them with discreet stickers (for placement on car or house window) and tailored photo IDs to alert officers about special circumstances when approaching.
In the pilot effort, tracker wristbands will be offered to twelve individuals; stickers and ID cards will be offered to more citizens who may want the special alerts.
No matching funds are required.
Every attempt will be made to gain approvals, set up accounts, and make purchases by June 30, 2018.
