SECTION I: BE IT ESTABLISHED AND ORDAINED BY THE ANNAPOLIS 1

CITY COUNCIL that the Code of the City of Annapolis shall be amended to read as 2 follows: 3

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TITLE 12 – VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

Chapter 12.32 – SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL PARKING DISTRICTS

9 Section 12.32.010 - Purpose.

10 The health, safety and welfare of many residents are affected adversely by burdens 11 placed on residents by virtue of the existence of major public facilities and programs. 12 Frequently, the use of streets within residential areas for the parking of vehicles by persons 13 using adjacent governmental, commercial, industrial, educational, and transit areas and 14 other areas, facilities and programs emanating from planning, zoning and other decisions 15 by government results in hazardous traffic conditions, the over burdening of existing 16 streets, roads and other facilities, air and noise pollution, and the inability of residents of 17 certain areas to obtain adequate parking adjacent to or close by their places of residence 18 and to secure ease of access to their places of residence. In order to reduce, to the extent 19 possible, the conditions described in this section, to foster the use of mass transit facilities 20 AND RIDE-SHARING, TO ENCOURAGE USE OF UNDERUTILIZED CITY 21 GARAGES, and to promote the safety, peace, good order, comfort, convenience, health 22 and welfare of the residents of the City, it is essential that the parking permit authorization 23

- provided for in this chapter be enacted. 24
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Section 12.32.070 - Regulations—Promulgation by Mayor.

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> Upon the recommendation of the Transportation Board, and in coordination with the 28 DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION Police Chief and any authorized agent as defined 29 in Section 12.04.020, the Mayor may promulgate regulations to implement and administer 30 a residential parking permit program. These regulations shall be promulgated only upon 31 32 the recommendation of the board after an advertised public hearing. Each regulation shall have the force and effect of law not less than forty-five days after its issuance by the Mayor, 33 provided no objection to any regulation has been registered by the City Council by a 34 35 resolution adopted at a regular or special meeting of the City Council within the forty-five day period. 36

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Section 12.32.080 - Permit—Application.

40 A. An application for a residential parking district permit shall be made by a resident of 41 a district to the DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION OR THE AUTHORIZED AGENT Finance Department at any City office designated by the Finance Director or 42 by the authorized agent, on forms as are prescribed by the DIRECTOR OF 43 TRANSPORTATION Finance Director or THE DIRECTOR'S his/her designee. 44 45

- The application for a permit shall contain information to verify that the applicant is a 1 B. 2 bona fide resident of the district for which application has been made and has legal title to or the right to possession of the motor vehicle to be registered. The information 3 4 shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
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- 1. Name and address of owner of motor vehicle;
- 2. Applicant's address;
- The make, model, color, state of registration, and license number of the motor 8 3. vehicle:
 - 4. The principal driver's name, operator's permit number, and state of issuance;
 - Applicant's operator's permit number and state of issuance; and 5.
 - The motor vehicle registration, operator's permit and any other relevant 6. documents.
- C. A parking permit may not be issued or renewed for any motor vehicle for which one 15 or more citations issued by the City for parking violations remain unpaid. 16
- The DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION Finance Director or the authorized agent 18 D. 19 shall issue the parking permit, upon finding that the applicant meets the requirements specified in this chapter. The DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION finance director 20 or the authorized agent shall prepare the application form and may require the 21 applicant to provide such additional information as may be necessary to determine 22 eligibility for a parking permit. 23
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25 Section 12.32.090 - Resident status.

- Resident status for purposes of obtaining a resident parking permit for a motor vehicle 27 A. 28 is established by meeting the criteria of any of the enumerated items:
 - Applicant has a current Maryland vehicle registration and current Maryland 1. driver's license with an address in parking district,
- 32 2. Applicant is owner and occupant of A residential property LOCATED IN A SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT AND THE PROPERTY IS 33 DESIGNATED AS THE OWNER'S PRINCIPAL RESIDENCE WITH THE 34 35 STATE DEPARTMENT OF ASSESSMENTS AND TAXATION. which is in parking district. Ownership can be established by records of Maryland 36 Department of Assessments and Taxation. These records are on-line. Occupancy 37 38 may be demonstrated by current utility bills, the absence of a City rental license, or some other means acceptable to the City. 39
- Applicant is lessee of residential property LOCATED in A SPECIAL 40 3. **RESIDENTIAL** parking district THAT IS licensed as rental unit. Applicant must 41 submit A copy of THE lease, A COPY OF THE CURRENT RENTAL UNIT 42 LICENSE, AND EVIDENCE OF OCCUPANCY THAT IS ACCEPTABLE TO 43 THE CITY. Parking permit expires with lease, or 44
- Applicant is on active military status and resides in parking district as reflected in 45 4. 46 documents issued by United States military authorities.

- 2 B. The determination of whether an applicant has established resident status shall be 3 made by the DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION Finance Director or THE 4 DIRECTOR'S his designee OR THE AUTHORIZED AGENT.
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Section 12.32.100 - Permit—Void.

8 A permit is void when the licensee no longer resides within the district, as defined in this chapter. A licensee shall remove any permit sticker, tag or barcode from any vehicle 9 registered to park within the district upon moving outside of the district and shall notify 10 the City or the authorized agent. Permits shall be transferred from one vehicle to another 11 during the permit year solely in accordance with regulations ESTABLISHED BY THE 12 13 DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION governing such transfers.

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Section 12.32.110 - Permit—Fee—Renewal.

- The fee for a residential parking permit in special residential parking districts shall be 17 A. established by resolution of the City Council. 18
- 19 20 B. The fee shall be payable at the time of the submission of the application for the permit. The permit year shall commence on July 1st and terminate on June 30th. Residential 21 parking permits may be renewed from year to year by qualified residents upon the 22 payment of the annual fee on or before June 30th of each year. Residential parking 23 permits may be renewed via mail by sending the completed and signed application 24 25 form, copies of all required documents and the renewal fee. The fee shall be prorated 26 based on the number of months that a resident requires the permit from the date of issue to the end of the fiscal year based on the number of months that a resident 27 requires a permit. However, the City shall not refund any permit issued due to disuse. 28
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- C. Subject to the availability of funds, the Department of Finance and/or the authorized 30 agent may develop the capability of renewing resident parking district permits online. 31
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Section 12.32.120 - Permit—Display.

The permit shall be affixed to the vehicle as prescribed in the regulations. The design 35 and content of the permit shall be prescribed in the regulations. Subject to the availability 36 of funds, the Department of TRANSPORTATION Finance and/or the authorized agent 37 38 may develop the capability of synchronizing the resident parking district permits with 39 resident license plates so that no sticker, tag or barcode is required.

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41 Section 12.32.130 - Permit—Replacement.

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43 When a vehicle to which a permit is issued and/or to which a permit sticker, tag or barcode is affixed is sold, transferred, demolished, or in any other manner rendered 44 45 unusable to the licensee, the licensee shall remove any permit sticker, tag or barcode from 46 the vehicle and may request the issuance of a replacement permit. The licensee shall notify

the DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION Police Chief OR and the authorized agent of 1 the change in status of the vehicle. An application for a replacement permit shall be in 2 accordance with the provisions for an application for an original or renewal permit. The 3 4 replacement permit shall be issued and be valid for the unexpired term of the original permit, except that a replacement permit may not be issued for any motor vehicle for which 5 one or more citations issued by the City for parking violations remain unpaid. The original 6 permit, upon the issuance of the replacement permit, is void. If evidence of the destruction 7 of the original permit is not presented at the time the application for a replacement permit 8 is made, the application shall be treated as though it is for an original permit. 9

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Section 12.32.140 - Permit—Temporary.

13 A. The DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION OR THE DIRECTOR'S Police Chief or his/her designee, or the authorized agent shall issue a multiple-day or single-day 14 temporary residential parking permitS TO AN APPLICANT WHO MEETS ANY OF 15 THE RESIDENT STATUS REQUIREMENTS IN SECTION 12.32.090. within a 16 residential parking district. Multiple day permits may be purchased by an applicant 17 when needed and shall be used for predetermined dates. A MAXIMUM OF FIVE Up 18 to ten single-day TEMPORARY RESIDENTIAL PARKING permits PER 19 **RESIDENCE** may be purchased per CALENDAR month, WHICH SHALL EXPIRE 20 ON THE LAST DAY OF THE CALENDAR MONTH IN WHICH THE PERMITS 21 WERE PURCHASED. for undetermined dates; upon usage, the resident shall validate 22 the single-day permit by entering the date of the day for which the single-day permit 23 is being used. AN APPLICANT WHO MEETS ANY OF THE RESIDENT STATUS 24 25 REOUIREMENTS IN SECTION 12.32.090 MAY ALSO RECEIVE AN 26 ADDITIONAL TWENTY-FIVE TEMPORARY RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMITS PER RESIDENCE PER FISCAL YEAR, WHICH SHALL EXPIRE ON 27 THE LAST DAY OF THE FISCAL YEAR IN WHICH THE PERMITS WERE 28 ISSUED. THE PROCESS FOR APPLYING FOR TEMPORARY RESIDENTIAL 29 PARKING PERMITS An application for a temporary permit shall be made by a 30 resident of a district on a form or online as shall be prescribed by the Director of 31 32 Transportation or the authorized agent. The fee for a temporary residential parking permit shall be established by resolution of the City Council. 33

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35 A TEMPORARY RESIDENTIAL multiple-day or single-day parking permit may be B. issued for the vehicle of a person who is rendering medical care to a resident in a 36 special residential parking district. The DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION Chief 37 38 of Police, or the DIRECTOR'S Chief's designee, or the authorized agent shall determine eligibility for such a permit. In the discretion of the DIRECTOR OF 39 40 TRANSPORTATION Chief of Police or the DIRECTOR'S Chiefs designee OR THE 41 AUTHORIZED AGENT, the permit is transferable. The permit is valid for up to one month, but may be renewed. The fee shall be established by RESOLUTION OF the 42 City Council but may for good cause be waived BY THE DIRECTOR OF 43 TRANSPORTATION. 44

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46 Section 12.32.145 – NONRESIDENT PARKING PERMIT

1 A. THE DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE OR 2 3 THE AUTHORIZED AGENT MAY ISSUE A NONRESIDENT PARKING PERMIT TO A PROPERTY OWNER WHOSE PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN A 4 SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL PARKING DISTRICT, BUT WHOSE PROPERTY IS 5 NOT DESIGNATED AS THE OWNER'S PRINCIPAL RESIDENCE WITH THE 6 STATE DEPARTMENT OF ASSESSMENT AND TAXATION. USE OF A 7 NONRESIDENT PARKING PERMIT SHALL BE LIMITED TO THE PERIOD OF 8 TIME THE OWNER OCCUPIES THE RESIDENCE. THE APPLICANT SHALL 9 10 SUBMIT PROOF OF PROPERTY OWNERSHIP AND A DRIVER'S LICENSE AND VEHICLE REGISTRATION IN THE PROPERTY OWNER'S NAME OR A 11 VEHICLE RENTAL CONTRACT IN THE PROPERTY OWNER'S NAME, AND 12 INDICATE THE PERIOD OF OCCUPANCY. NONRESIDENT PARKING 13 PERMITS MAY NOT BE ISSUED TO PROPERTY OWNERS WHOSE 14 PROPERTIES ARE LICENSED FOR RENTAL BY THE CITY. THE FEE FOR A 15 NONRESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT SHALL BE ESTABLISHED BY 16 **RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL.** 17 18 19 SECTION II: AND BE IT FURTHER ESTABLISHED AND ORDAINED BY 20 THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL that this ordinance shall take effect on July 1, 21 2019. 22 23 24 25
