 7 The National Fire Protection Association Life Safety Code 101 ADOPTED BY SECTION

 14 actual performance of the system meets or exceeds the hydraulic calculation of the

 30 A. **ENTRY AND EXAMINATION.** THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO
 31 SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLINGS OR TWO-FAMILY DWELLINGS. OTHERWISE, ~~To~~ the
 32 ~~full~~ FULLEST extent permitted by law, the Fire Department shall have the ~~authorization~~
 33 AUTHORITY to enter and examine, at all reasonable times, any building, structure, marine vessel,
 34 vehicle, or premises for the purpose of making fire safety inspections.

 38 B. **CREDENTIALS REQUIRED.** Persons ~~authorized to~~ WHO enter and inspect

15 A. **Purpose.** The Director of Finance shall establish and maintain a Sprinkler
 16 Assistance Revolving Fund ~~and an Electrical Assistance Revolving Fund~~ and necessary procedures
 17 for the purpose of encouraging the installation of sprinklers ~~and upgrading of electrical systems~~ in
 18 ~~older~~ EXISTING buildings so as to increase the safety of residents, FIRE FIGHTERS AND FIRST
 19 RESPONDERS, ~~and to~~ minimize damage resulting from fire, and ~~to~~ allow greater utilization of
 20 currently vacant or underutilized space. The Sprinkler Assistance Revolving Fund will operate by
 21 making low cost loans to developers or property owners of ~~older~~ EXISTING buildings that do not
 22 ~~currently~~ have sprinkler systems installed at the time of AN application. ~~The Electrical Assistance~~
 23 ~~Revolving Fund will operate by making low cost loans to developers or property owners of older~~
 24 ~~buildings in the Historic District that do not currently have modern electrical systems installed at~~
 25 ~~the time of application.~~

26

27 B. **Financing of Revolving Fund.** ~~Through the normal City budgeting and~~
 28 ~~amendment process, funds FUNDS are authorized IN THE BUDGET FOR to be allocated to the~~
 29 ~~SPRINKLER Assistance Revolving Funds from the General Fund. Funds FUND may be made~~
 30 ~~available for eligible COSTS purposes during any budget year. As loans are repaid back into the~~
 31 ~~respective funds, those amounts become available for new loans. At no time may the total~~
 32 ~~outstanding balance of all loans exceed the total amounts made available in the budget process.~~

33

34 C. **Interest Rate.** The interest rate to be charged to the borrower is to be one percent
 35 per ~~annum~~ YEAR unless otherwise established by resolution of the City Council.

36

37 D. **THOSE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE ASSISTANCE FROM THE FUND.**
 38 **Eligibility.** Loans may ~~only~~ be made to developers or owners for the rehabilitation of existing
 39 commercial or residential buildings. LOANS MAY NOT BE MADE FOR NEW BUILDINGS.
 40 ~~Further, loans~~ LOANS may only be made ~~where such~~ WHEN THE loans are part of a funding
 41 package that will result in the affected building being fully sprinkled ~~consistent with Chapter 17.20~~
 42 ~~and/or being fully brought into compliance with electrical requirements in Chapter 17.16. Loans~~
 43 ~~may not be made for new buildings.~~

44

45 E. **COSTS THAT MAY BE FUNDED USING THE REVOLVING FUND.**
 46 Eligible costs that may be funded ~~with the~~ BY A loan ~~proceeds~~ are limited to ~~the installation of~~

1 ~~electrical systems in the Historic District for the Electrical Assistance Revolving Fund, and~~
2 COSTS DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE installation of sprinklers, ~~including labor and materials~~
3 ~~and hook up to the City water supply for the Sprinkler Assistance Revolving Fund.~~ LESS ANY
4 CITY PROPERTY TAX CREDITS FOR WHICH THE PROPERTY OWNER MAY BE
5 ELIGIBLE PURSUANT TO SECTION 6.04.130 AND 6.04.230 OF THIS CODE.

7 **F. LOAN AMOUNTS.** LOAN AMOUNTS MAY NOT EXCEED \$20,000.

8
9 **E.G. Loan Approval.** THE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE, IN CONSULTATION WITH
10 THE FIRE CHIEF, MAY APPROVE AN APPLICATION FOR A LOAN, IF FUNDS ARE
11 AVAILABLE AND THE APPLICATION IS ~~Applications that are complete and meet~~ MEETS all
12 appropriate requirements. ~~may be approved by the Director of Finance on a first come, first served~~
13 ~~basis. If the loans requested in complete applications in hand exceed the amount available for new~~
14 ~~loans, the applications shall be ranked by age of building, location of building, historical~~
15 ~~significance, and other relevant factors as determined by the Director of Finance. A loan may be~~
16 ~~recalled by the Director of Finance if the Chief of the Fire Department and/or the Director of~~
17 ~~Planning and Zoning find that any element of the rehabilitation of the building for which a sprinkler~~
18 ~~or electrical loan is requested is not in compliance with applicable provisions of the City Code.~~

20 **F.H. Loan Disbursement.** Upon issuance of the A building FIRE permit by the
21 ~~Department of Planning and Zoning,~~ the Director of Finance may disburse the funds for the
22 approved loan to the borrower. The borrower ~~must~~ SHALL request disbursement of the loan within
23 one year of notification of loan approval unless the Chief of the Fire Department ~~and/or~~ the
24 Director of Planning and Zoning ~~find~~ FINDS that the delay in the borrower's request for
25 disbursement is not due to factors under the borrower's control.

26
27 **G.I. Repayment.** THE BORROWER SHALL REPAY ~~Repayment of the loan by the~~
28 ~~borrower will be made on a monthly basis~~ according to terms and procedures established by the
29 Director of Finance. ~~A~~ THE TERM OF THE loan ~~period~~ may not exceed five years from the date
30 the funds are disbursed to the borrower. ~~However, if~~ IF the property for which the loan is made is
31 TRANSFERRED BEFORE THE OUTSTANDING PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST HAS BEEN
32 REPAID, ~~sold within the loan period, then~~ the outstanding PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST ~~balance~~
33 ~~of the loan on the date of sale must~~ SHALL BE IMMEDIATELY DUE AND PAYABLE AND

1
2 A. **Applicability.** This section applies only to ALL buildings and structures in the
3 Historic District which are subject to the requirement of a building permit issued by the City of
4 Annapolis WITHIN THE AREA SHOWN ON THE MAP ATTACHED AS APPENDIX A.
5

6 B. **REQUIREMENT TO HAVE FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEM.** All new
7 construction and all renovations which have a value of at least ten percent of the assessed value of
8 the existing building or structure are subject to the requirement that upon completion of
9 construction or renovation, there will have been installed a fully functioning interior fire
10 suppression system throughout the structure. For purposes of this section, "renovation" includes
11 an addition to the existing structure. The term "value" does not include the cost of the fire
12 suppression system. In applying for a building permit, the owner shall submit plans for an
13 appropriate interior fire suppression system which will be capable of containing a fire until the fire
14 suppression personnel can respond and extinguish the fire. When activated, the system shall
15 immediately and automatically alert a monitoring service of the occurrence of a fire and the
16 location of the structure. The proposed fire suppression system shall be one which can be installed
17 with the least damage to the existing interior fabric and still perform the intended function. The
18 plans shall be approved by the Fire Chief. In consultation with the Historic Preservation Officer,
19 the Fire Chief shall interior fire suppression systems which meet recognized national standards.
20 These regulations shall be posted on the City's website. The recognition of specific interior fire
21 suppression systems does not preclude an owner from proposing a system which is not the subject
22 of the regulation nor does it preclude the Fire Chief from approving the proposed system. This
23 section shall not take effect until the State and/or Federal governments have enacted legislation
24 which grants a credit against income tax liability for at least seventy five percent of the cost of
25 installing an appropriate fire suppression system. BY DECEMBER 31, 2025, ALL BUILDINGS
26 TO WHICH THIS SECTION APPLIES SHALL HAVE A FULLY FUNCTIONING INTERIOR
27 FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEM. WHEN ACTIVATED, THE SYSTEM SHALL IMMEDIATELY
28 AND AUTOMATICALLY ALERT A MONITORING SERVICE.
29

30 C. **PLANS.** IN APPLYING FOR A PERMIT, THE OWNER SHALL SUBMIT
31 PLANS FOR AN INTERIOR FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEM CAPABLE OF CONTAINING A
32 FIRE UNTIL THE FIRE SUPPRESSION PERSONNEL CAN RESPOND.
33

34 D. **RESPONSIBILITY OF PROPERTY OWNER.** THE PROPERTY OWNER
35 SHALL PAY FOR INSTALLATION OF THE ENTIRE FIRE SPRINKLER SYSTEM,
36 INCLUDING THE LATERAL FROM THE WATER MAIN INTO THE BUILDING, AND
37 MAY NOT TRANSFER OR ASSIGN THIS RESPONSIBILITY TO A TENANT.
38

39 **17.20.12017.20.130 - Fire Prevention Code violation.**
40

41 A. A violation of any provision of this chapter is declared a municipal infraction subject to
42 a civil fine as established by resolution of the City Council. Each day that a violation continues
43 constitutes a separate offense.

45 B. It is unlawful to ignore or deface a stop work order, unsafe order, or unfit order issued
46 by the Code Official.
