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15 **Affordable Housing Task Force – Membership**

17 **FOR** the purpose of revising the qualifications for certain members to be appointed to the Task
18 Force.

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20 **WHEREAS**, On March 9, 2020, the City Council adopted R-19-20 for the purpose of
21 establishing the Affordable Housing Task Force commissioned to assess the current
22 and projected future landscape of housing affordability in the City of Annapolis,
23 evaluate current programs and initiatives to produce new affordable housing and
24 preserve existing ones; and

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26 **WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to revise the qualifications for certain members to be
27 appointed to the Task Force as set forth in Paragraph 1, of the first Resolve.

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29 **NOW, THEREFORE,**

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31 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that the qualifications of certain
32 members to be appointed to the Affordable Housing Task Force shall be amended as follows:

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34 1. All members of the Affordable Housing Task Force shall be appointed by the Mayor. The
35 Task Force shall be comprised of the following individuals:

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37 2 members of the Housing and Human Welfare Committee
38 1 member of the Housing and Community Development Committee
39 2 individuals from the Mayor’s Office, namely, the African American & Hispanic
40 Liaisons
41 2 individuals from the Annapolis Planning & Zoning Department
42 2 individuals from the Housing Authority of the City of Annapolis, namely, 1
43 individual from the Executive Director’s Staff and 1 individual of the Board of
44 Commissioners
45 2 individuals representing Anne Arundel County Government
46 1 individual designated by the 30A State Delegation

- 1 individual from the Annapolis Office of Economic Development
- 3 individuals who are each members of a non-profit organization focused on affordable or fair housing
- 1 individual from the Annapolis Department of Transportation
- 1 individual from the Annapolis Finance Department
- 3 individuals who possess a Maryland State Real Estate License and who each have a minimum of 5 active years of real estate experience
- 3 individuals from development companies with a concentration in affordable housing, ~~which do not have an interest in current or future development in the City limits~~
- 4 community leaders residing in the City of Annapolis
- 16 residents from the Housing Authority of the City of Annapolis, 2 from each of the Public Housing and Mixed-Income Properties

2. Task Force members shall serve without compensation.
3. The Task Force shall elect from among their appointed membership a chair, vice-chair, and a secretary.
4. The Task Force shall have at least 3 meetings at which the Task Force takes public testimony about housing affordability, the needs and desires of residents, and to share their findings.
5. The Task Force may adopt rules of procedure as it deems necessary and appropriate for the conduct of its meetings and activities. The Task Force shall publish a report by July 31, 2020, to include its findings and recommendations concerning the existing landscape of affordable housing options and projected future needs, current programs and initiatives to create and preserve housing affordability, and recommended policy response to ensure a vibrant mix of accessible housing options for all City residents.
6. The Task Force shall have 4 separate committees - Policy and Recommendations, Community Engagement, Needs Assessment, and Feasibility:
 - The Policy and Recommendations Committee shall be tasked with assessing a variety of housing policies, for both short- and long-term implementation. It will analyze the best practices nationally and locally, focusing on preserving affordability, building mixed-income communities, and measures for anti-displacement.
 - The Community Engagement Committee advises the Task Force on the most comprehensive method to include the community in the Task Force recommendations. The committee shall be comprised of community organizations, elected officials, and other representatives. This committee shall organize the outreach campaign to include Annapolis residents.
 - The Needs Assessment Committee will be tasked with studying and analyzing data, trends, and market demands associated with local and county housing markets. It will review the existing housing conditions in the City of Annapolis and perform demand

1 analysis, identify gaps within the market, and provide scenario studies. This Committee's
2 report will detail the City of Annapolis's existing housing market and trends.

4 - The Feasibility Committee shall be tasked with studying the implications and impacts
5 associated with the various policies and programs being reviewed by the Task Force. They
6 will assess the legal, financial, and organizational capacity to support new policies and
7 programs aimed at building mixed-income communities and preserving affordability.

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9 7. The specific tasks and deliverables of the Task Force shall include, but are not limited to, the
10 following:

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12 - a definition or definitions of 'affordable', as it relates to housing (rental and for-sale),
13 which shall inform future policymaking;

14 - a housing study which includes current and projected future housing market conditions,
15 an inventory of existing affordable housing, and a projected inventory of affordable
16 housing through at least 2024;

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18 - an analysis and evaluation of current policies, programs, and initiatives related to
19 affordable housing production and preservation

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21 - recommendations for the creation of new policies, programs, or initiatives and the
22 expansion of existing ones to increase the supply of affordable housing in the City of
23 Annapolis commensurate with current and projected future needs.

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25 8. The City Council, in partnership with the Mayor's Office, the Finance Department, and the
26 City Manager shall make financial resources available to the Task Force for professional
27 and technical services in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 should these resources become
28 necessary in order for the Task Force to complete its work.

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30 9. The Affordable Housing Task Force shall present its findings and recommendations to the
31 City Council at a meeting to be held no later than September 30, 2020.

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33 10. The City Council, in partnership with the Mayor's Office, shall take action on the Task
34 Force's recommendations no later than December 31, 2020.
