26	WHEREAS	on June 18, 2018, the City Council unanimously adopted Resolution R-28-18 to
27	W IILICLING,	express its support for the Equal Justice Initiative, to move toward a more complete
28		history of race relations and to affirm the City's commitment to truth, freedom and
29		equity.

31	WHEREAS,	on May 25, 2020, George Floyd, an African American man died at the hands of
32		four Minneapolis, Minnesota, police officers; and
33		
34	WHEREAS,	according to reports, one of these officers held his knee on Mr. Floyd's neck for 8
35		minutes and 46 seconds; 2 minutes and 53 seconds of which occurred after Mr.
36 37		Floyd became unresponsive, and according to the criminal complaint filed against the officer, Mr. Floyd was handcuffed and lying prone on the road throughout that
38		time. Three other officers participated in this death, with one holding Mr. Floyd's
39		back, one holding his legs, and the fourth looking on as he stood nearby. According
40		to the Minneapolis Fire Department, paramedics moved Mr. Floyd from the
41		location and were doing chest compressions and other lifesaving measures on an
42		"unresponsive, pulseless male", after which time Mr. Floyd was taken to Hennepin
43		County Medical Center where he was pronounced dead. The family autopsy stated
44		"asphyxiation from sustained pressure was the cause" of Mr. Floyd's death.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, the officer who held his knee on Mr. Floyd's neck, was arrested on May 29, 2020 and faces charges of second-degree murder and manslaughter, according to th		
4 5 6	Hennepin County Attorney. As of this writing, the other three officers will b criminally charged but actual charges are not known, according to Senator Am Klobuchar.		
7 8 9	WHEREAS, our local public leaders have spoken out as follows:
