20	WHEREAS,	this year commemorates 175 years of leadership, service, and tradition at the United	
21	,	States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland; and	
22			
23	WHEREAS,	on October 10, 1845, "The Naval School" was established by then-Secretary of the	
24		Navy George Bancroft on a 10-acre Army post in Annapolis called Fort Severn.	
25		There were initially only 50 students and seven faculty members, and the	
26		curriculum included mathematics and navigation, gunnery and steam propulsion,	
27		chemistry, English, natural philosophy, and French; and	
28			
29	WHEREAS,	in 1850 "The Naval School" became the United States Naval Academy and a new	
30		curriculum went into effect requiring midshipmen to study at the Academy for four	
31		years and to train aboard ships each summer; and	
32			
33	WHEREAS,	as the U.S. Navy grew over the years, the United States Naval Academy expanded	
34		from a campus of 10 acres to 338 acres, the original student body of 50 midshipmen	
35		grew to a brigade size of nearly 4,400, the initial seven member faculty grew to	
36		more than 1,200 faculty, staff, and coaches, and modern granite buildings replaced	
37		the old wooden structures of Fort Severn; and

39	WHEREAS,	the development of the United States Naval Academy has reflected the history of	
40		the country; as America has changed culturally and technologically so has the	
41		Naval Academy. In 1949, Wesley A. Brown became the first African-American	
42		graduate, the class of 1980 was the first class to graduate women, and the class of	
43		2023 included 312 women (26%) and a total of 471 minority midshipmen (40%)

1	WHEREAS,	today, the United States Naval Academy offers midshipmen state-of-the-art
2		academic and professional training in subjects such as cyber security, seamanship
3		and navigation tactics, naval engineering, naval weapons, leadership, ethics and

7		relationship with its surrounding community and the City of Annapolis is proud to
