Blessed In Tech Ministries	CDBG Funds will be used to carry out Food Fridays from the Pip Moyer Recreation Center. BITM will pick up food from the Maryland Food Bank which is donating the food valued at about \$260,000 annually, and make it available for distribution at the Pip Moyer Center on Fridays for families in need of food. The CDBG funds will be used to manage the program including staffing and transporting food. BITM also provides food distribution services to Food Fridays (Pip Moyer) Men on a Mission Mobile Pantry and the Go Feed Anne Arundel/Tyler Heights Mobile Pantry	\$ 120,000.00
Arundel Lodge	CDBG funds will be used to retrofit faucets to touchless in its residential treatment facilities in the city which house its psychologically disabled residents to cut down the spread of COVID. Arundel Lodge will also use CDBG funds to provide PPE and to disinfect in its residences. They will also make alterations to the front desk to contain the spread of COVID.	\$50,000
CoOp Arundel	My Sistah's Keeper (MSK) Initiative is designed for a class of 15 women from low income/public housing communities in Annapolis. This project is designed specifically to help this population address the challenges they face in response to the current coronavirus pandemic. Research has indicated that the impact of COVID-19 has been especially detrimental in disadvantaged communities and in communities of color. This funding will be used to provide PPE for in-person sessions and educational training about the virus, testing and the vaccine.	\$ 10,000.00
Superior Future	Many of the activities usually available to youth in the Annapolis community have been disrupted because of school, cultural venue and athletic facility closures. In 2020 alone, their programs managed to connect with more than 100 youth, making Superior Future an ideal organization to provide programs that young people have access to learning new skills and connecting with the community during the pandemic. CDBG funds will be used to funds to ensure there is access to programming that helps youth maximize outcomes of e-learning, develop skills in carpentry and urban farming.	\$ 40,000.00
