**WHEREAS**, Ordinance 26-19 amends Chapter 17.44 of the Code of Annapolis concerning rental unit and short term residential rental licenses; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution 31-19 updates the fines schedule concerning rental unit and short term residential rental licenses.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that Chapter 17.44 of the Annapolis FY 2020 Fines Schedule is amended as follows:

<del>17.44.020.B</del>	POSTING OF UNLICENSED PREMISES	\$100 PER VIOLATION PER DAY	\$100 PER VIOLATION PER DAY

<del>17.44.040.B</del> <u>17.44.010.B</u>	Rental <del>unit</del> OPERATING license.	\$200 per violation per day	\$200 per violation per day
<del>17.44.140.B</del> <u>17.44.080.B</u>	Revocation, vacating premises and condemnation penalties.	\$100 per violation per day	\$100 per violation per day
