
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Overdose Data Review

Data is provided by APD and is the best available information as of February 27, 2025.

2024: Ward 8 Overview

- 2024: Second lowest reported overdoses in Ward 8 since 2015
 - 2015 = 4 overdoses
 - **2024 = 5 overdoses**
 - \circ 2022 = 9 overdoses
 - \circ 2023 = 9 overdoses
- Citywide, Ward 8 reported the second lowest number of overdoses
 - Ward 5 & 7 were tied for lowest (2 each)
- Zero fatal overdoses were reported in Ward 8
 - $\circ~$ Also zero ODs reported for Wards 1 & 7 $\,$
- Narcan usage was reported to have been used in 60% of overdoses in Ward 8






2024: Locations of Overdoses (Ward 8)




- (1) 6th St & Severn Ave

- (2) Madison St


80% of Ward 8's overdoses are along or within two blocks of Madison St.



2024: Demographics (Ward 8)



Historically, 25-34, 35-44 and 45-54 age groups have the most overdoses in both Ward 8 and citywide.



Black/AA represented the largest group for overdoses in Ward 8 for 2024. However, 6 of the last 10 years the largest group has been the White population for Ward 8. In 2024, 65% of all overdoses in the City were African American. **2024: Fatalities (Citywide)**

Reported Fatal Overdoses in 2024

WARD 8: Reported zero fatal overdoses. Also zero fatal overdoses in 5 of the last 10 years.

CITYWIDE: Reported the lowest number of fatal overdoses since 2018.


CITYWIDE: Black/AA represented the largest group for fatal overdoses in 2024. However, in 2022 and 2023, the White population lead in fatal overdoses.

Food Friday Overview



- The Food Friday Program provides boxes of fresh and canned fruits and vegetables, frozen meat, rice, pasta and other non perishable foods to residents of Annapolis.
- Distributes approximately 275 boxes of food every week to support 840 Annapolitans facing food insecurity. Program is Volunteer run.
- Rec & Parks provides work space in the Pip Moyer Gymnasium.
- Food is provided by Anne Arundel Food Bank.
- Alderwoman O'Neill is the organizer of the program.

Total Number of Food Boxes prepared for Ward 8: 16 These Food Boxes Benefit:

- 16 Families
- 52 Individuals
- 8 Seniors
- 17 Children

Americana Dr. Residents: 27 individuals and 5 Families

(Accounts for 31.3% of deliveries in Ward 8)


