**FOR** the purpose of establishing fees required by the adoption of O-6,25, Clearing Snow and Ice from City Sidewalks.

**WHEREAS,** O-6-25, Clearing Snow and Ice from City Sidewalks includes the authority for the City to issue certain fees; and

**WHEREAS,** The amount of those fees needs to be established by resolution.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ANNAPOLIS CITY COUNCIL** that

1. The Fees Schedule shall be amended as follows:

	<u>Tier 2 (30 to 50 feet)</u>	2. <u>\$ 300.00</u>
	<u>Tier 3 (50 to 85 feet)</u>	3. <u>\$ 400.00</u>
	<u>Tier 4 (85 to 250 feet)</u>	4. <u>\$1,000.00</u>
	<u>Tier 5 (250 feet or more)</u>	5. <u>\$2,000.00</u>
