Their programming included bringing in guest speakers on a number of topics. They created the Annual Drug Free Kids Campaign and hosted an annual celebration. Their mentors met weekly at the library which became a comfortable place of solace for the youth. College planning, family nights and dinners, was a family activity. Youth visited the Entrepreneurial Innovative Center during a Bowie campus tour. The youth volunteered at the Lighthouse Bistro and during winter relief at first Baptist Church. They went through scholarship Boot Camp and while visiting Morgan State University, they went on a nature escape at Loch Raven. Charting Careers worked closely with leaders in the communities to address the concerns that arise. In four short weeks, the Trust signed up 57 students to be involved in their filmmaking and music production program. For four years, Zeta Gamma Boule' worked with high school students across the city. They provided 40 hour SAT preparation and college counseling which included a mix of classroom instruction and professional counseling, and diagnostic testing. During the past year, they took students on two college tours where students were acceptance on the spot. They also took students to an Orioles game after which they had an opportunity to meet with the Vice President of Orioles Corporate and learned about careers with the team. Some of those careers require college degrees and many do not. They took 40 youth to meet with the Baltimore Electricians Union where they learned about trade careers. Zeta Gamma provides ongoing mentoring and scholarships, raising over \$10,000 for scholarships. They paid for the scholarship applications for 100 students. OHLA is dedicated to empowering the Immigrant and Hispanic/Latinx community through direct services, policy advocacy, and research. They work to bridge the gap between underserved populations and the resources they need to thrive while specializing in culturally competent solutions. OHLA provides many of the direct services needed in Spanish, while also compiling data and researching information in order to better serve and advocate for the community. They are generating a comprehensive city-wide assessment of Hispanic community needs in Annapolis. The primary objective is to produce a detailed report that will serve as a critical resource for understanding and addressing the diverse needs of the Hispanic population. They developed a consistent weekend resource table to engage with the Latino community, connecting with at least 200 neighbors. They provided comprehensive support to 100 Latino residents which included social services, legal consultations, and access to healthcare and mental health. They reached out to each apartment complex that has high Latino population rates and worked with the property management companies to develop activities aimed to build community cohesion, foster trust, and empower the residents.
