Dwelling, Single-Family Detached. See illustration. "Single-family detached dwelling" means
a building containing one dwelling unit that is surrounded entirely by open space on the same
lot.

- Dwelling, Single-Family Attached. See illustration. "Single-family attached dwelling" means one of a series of two or more dwellings that can be joined to another dwelling at one or more sides by a party wall or walls, with each unit having its own separate exterior entrance(s). For example, townhouse, rowhouse, two-family dwelling, and quadraplex units are Single-family

- Dwelling, Two-Family. See illustration. "Two-family dwelling" means a building containing
 two dwelling units. Examples:
