AMENDMENT 5 – ALD. HUNTLEY

Amendment Summary:

Amendment 5:

- Requires sidewalk cafes to stop selling and serving alcoholic beverages 30 minutes before they close, but customers have until closing time to finish their beverages.
- Gives restaurants until 30 minutes *after* closing to clear the sidewalk of tables, chairs, etc., rather than 30 minutes before closing.

MOTION:

On Page 10:

Line 25, strike the comma after "sell" and after "sell" insert "or";

Line 26, strike "or allow consumption of"; and

Lines 30 & 32 strike "before" and after "minutes", insert "after".

2. Alcoholic Beverages.

- a. Before the establishment's expanded footprint is approved, a modification to a previously approved Alcoholic Beverage Control Board license showing the expanded service areas shall be required.
- b. The application shall include:
 - i. Site plan of the outside dining area;
 - ii. A plan to prevent the service of alcohol to minors; and
 - iii. Specific dates and hours for the designated area for outside dining.
- c. Notwithstanding any contrary or different hours of operation in its alcoholic beverages license, an operating establishment shall cease to sell or, serve or allow consumption of alcoholic beverages on its Sidewalk

Café at least 30 minutes before the establishment's permitted closing time.

3. Hours of Operation.

- <u>a.</u> All café seating shall be removed from the café area no later than 30 minutes beforeafter the operating establishment's permitted closing time.
- b. All other furniture, debris and obstructions to the sidewalk shall be cleared no later than 30 minutes beforeafter the permitted closing time unless the restaurant is located in the Historic District and exempted from this regulation by the Historic Preservation Commission.
